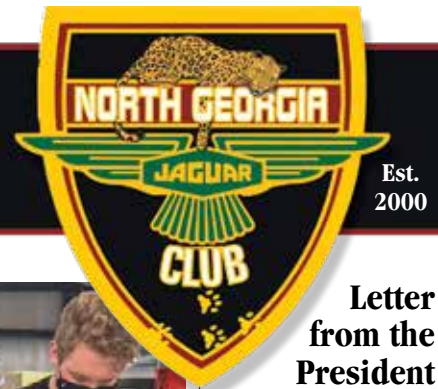

This is the final notification about the 2023 Judge's School. For current JCNA Judges, attendance is mandatory in order for you to maintain your Judge's credentials. As of July 17th, two of our Judges have notified me that they will not be participating in this year's Concours. While it has always been difficult to get enough club members to participate the loss of two fully certified Judges will only serve to exasperate the problem. If you have previously been a Judge and for whatever reason have decided not to continue, I am

making a personal plea for you to once again step up and support your club. It takes up to fifteen certified judges to host a Concours of just twenty Jags. Three Judges are required to judge a Champion Class, two for a Driven Class, one for O/V Inspection, a Reserve Judge, and a Chief Judge. If we don't field enough Judges, we have no choice but to limit the number of members who can participate, and this is traditionally one of our best events of the year.

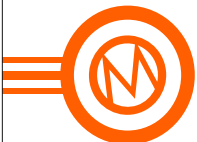

As it turns out, the JCNA has selected the Jaguar Society of South Carolina to host the 2023 International Jaguar Festival which will be held just outside of Columbia, SC between September 28th and October 1st. For those who complete the Judge's School, you have the opportunity to serve your apprenticeship at the IJF and then be fully certified for NGJC concours at the end of October. Our cadre of current Judges have the knowledge and experience to make your first JCNA Concours a memorable experience.

As we have done in years past complete the test prior to the Judge's School and return it to me. I will score the tests and will determine which areas we need to spend additional time on. This is an open book test so everyone should achieve a perfect score.

College With Leading Auto Restoration Program Gets Incredible \$1 Billion Donation

McPherson College, a Kansas-based institution with a leading automotive restoration program, has announced it has received a whopping \$1 billion contribution from an anonymous donor.

The unnamed benefactor offered to donate \$2 for every \$1 pledged by others. Initially, the generous backer capped his contribution to \$500 million. However, the school raised \$342 million through other efforts, seemingly inspiring the anonymous individual to donate \$1 billion to the college.

Add this to the existing endowment, and McPherson College has received nearly \$1.6 billion - the largest for any small US-based college. So why is this important to the automotive world? As mentioned, McPherson College has a relatively sizeable automotive restoration program, and according to the institution, the degree in restoration technology is the only one of its kind in the country. It's the only four-year program in the USA.

The \$1 billion isn't the only generous donation the college has been given. If you think the students in the auto restoration program are fixing up old Chevys and Nissans, think again. Apart from a \$50 million donation, Dr. Melanie Lundquist and Richard Lundquist donated a classic Ferrari to the college.

"It has also been one of our greatest pleasures to support McPherson's one-of-a-kind automotive restoration program. Richard was honored to donate his classic Ferrari to the program, and we are both thrilled that this unique program - and McPherson College - will be on solid footing for perpetuity as a result of this phenomenally generous matching gift," said Dr. Lundquist.

Currently, students in the automotive restoration faculty are hard at work rehabilitating a 1953 Mercedes-Benz cabriolet (a predecessor to the S-Class we know today), and the vehicle will be displayed at the prestigious 2023 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance later this year.

It's worth mentioning that the entire donation won't be directly funneled to the auto restoration program and will be used for several initiatives. The endowment has been named the Ward-Burkholder Endowment in honor of two alums who later became professors at the

college.

Part of the plans include helping students with financial aid, implementing rural health initiatives, and there are plans to build state-of-the-art facilities for the art science and engineering facilities. "I am incredibly grateful to our anonymous donor for giving us an



unprecedented opportunity and responsibility to build and implement our strategic vision of becoming a destination learning community," said McPherson College President Michael Schneider.

In 2021, a kind-hearted individual donated a Lotus T125 continuation car to the Genius Garage, a public educational charity that helps aspiring students in the automotive industry.

Jaguar Classic's new E-Type ZP Collection cars come as a pair

Restomod E-Types pay tribute to the E-Type's first race wins, and you can't just buy one

"With the greatest respect, forget everything that's gone before. When you look back to those cars, [the brief is] don't try to emulate them, don't try and do a retrospective pastiche, because that's not credible. It has to capture the essence of 'a copy of nothing'." Those were the words of creative boss Gerry McGovern when speaking about the future of Jaguar recently.

So, what's the first product that Jag unveils after setting out its plan to launch into a whole new world of electricity and non-retro design? Why of course it's a restomodded E-Type. Oh dear.

Although hang on, because this isn't just one restomodded E-Type. The ZP Collection actually features a pair of classic Jags that celebrate the E-Type's first two race wins just months after the car's introduction in 1961. And aren't they just stunning?

Of course this is the work of Jaguar Classic, and we're told that seven pairs of ZP Collection cars will be available, with each individual ZP (those were the letters allocated to the original racing E-Types project) taking 2,000 hours to complete.

As you'll have noticed, the cars in the ZP Collection include an Oulton Blue drophead coupe and a Crystal Grey fixed-head coupe. Now, all of the original ZP racers were drophead coupes, but if you're buying a modernised pair of tributes then why not have one of each style, right?

So, to each car. The blue drophead celebrates the E-Type that Graham Hill drove to victory at Oulton Park on 15 April 1961. The shiny grey fixed-head coupe pays tribute to the car – driven by Roy Salvadori – that came third in that race, although Salvadori would then go on to win at Crystal Palace on 21 May.

Both modern interpretations get white racing roundels and white lipstick, as well as chrome bumpers and wire wheels. Plus, the bar across the grille is removed to match the original racers.

There's red leather inside the Hill tribute and dark navy in the Salvadori coupe. Both get a special bit of artwork mounted on the transmission tunnel too, as well as a modern infotainment system with DAB radio, Bluetooth connectivity and sat nav.

Both cars are powered by the 3.8-litre straight-six that's making 265bhp, and there's a new close-ratio five-speed gearbox to make the restomods slightly easier to drive compared to the originals.



Whether any of the seven buyers actually choose to drive their tributes is another matter, but we're told that the lucky folk will also have the chance to buy a matching limited edition F-Type that will be unveiled later this year.

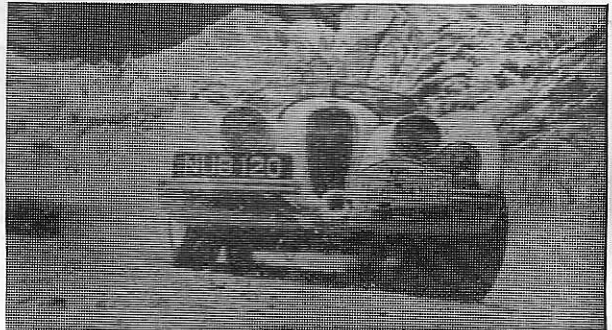

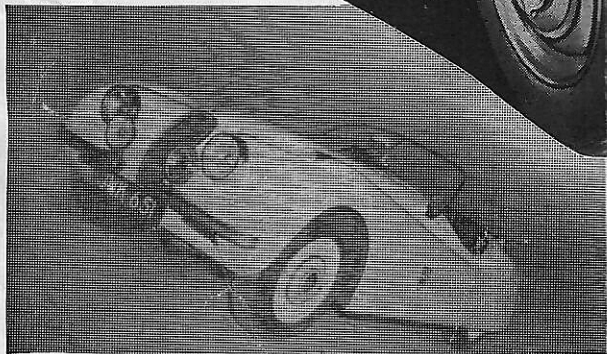
