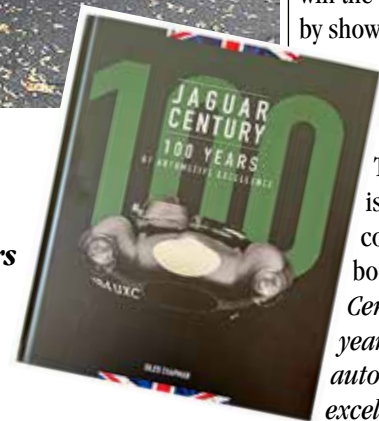

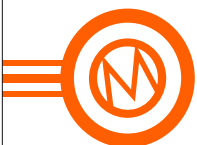

JCNA General Meeting in March

Next year's AGM is just under five months away and will be held in one of the premiere locations in the US - the San Francisco Bay area. The event will be held between March 9 - 11 at the Embassy Suites Waterfront hotel located just five minutes south of San Francisco International airport.

All rooms at this hotel are two room suites, many with waterfront views of the San Francisco Bay and the San Francisco skyline. The special low nightly room rate of \$175 includes Wi-Fi, reduced rate overnight parking, a full made to order breakfast and a free early evening reception every day with your choice of liquids and refreshments. A hotel shuttle is available to take you to and from the airport for a minimal fee. We anticipate that many attendees may want to extend their time while in the San Francisco area and for those who do, we have arranged to maintain our special hotel rate both three days before and after the meeting. Hotel reservations need to be made prior to February 1st to qualify for this special rate.

The meeting will be hosted by the Bay Area's Jaguar Associate Group (JAG) and we have planned a number of optional events designed to enhance your time while attending the AGM on Saturday. On Friday morning you may take a one hour boat tour of the San Francisco Bay. Coach transportation is included. This trip is limited to thirty people.

On Friday afternoon attendees will have the opportunity to visit the very private John Mozart Foundation Auto Museum. John Mozart has a collection of over 220 unique and spectacular cars, 70 of which will be on

display for us to admire with numerous docents available to provide the stories of the cars. Several of the cars in this world class collection are past winners at the prestigious Pebble Beach Concours. Coach transportation to and from the museum is included. There will be a limit of 70 people for this tour.

Friday night we will have a reception with no host bar and dinner allowing time for old friendships to be rekindled and new ones to be formed. Saturday afternoon, JAG will hold our annual People's Choice Car Show in the park adjacent to the hotel with magnificent views of the Bay. JCNA members who have driven to the event are encouraged to participate.

All attendees of the AGM are invited to view the car show at the conclusion of the AGM General Session (and before the breakout

sessions) and vote for their choices in each category. Saturday evening we will have the banquet reception where JCNA awards will be presented including those for the afternoon's People's Choice show. Our guest speaker will be Boris Gruzman describing the custom E-Type he built for the 2019 Peking to Paris rally and his many experiences driving the rally.

I encourage you to send your club's representatives to attend this meeting and enjoy their stay while visiting the Bay area. Reservations for the JCNA AGM, the optional events and the hotel can be made directly through our web site, www.jags.org.

Jaguar Confirms Death of the Internal Combustion Sports Car

The first gasoline-powered Jaguar sports car* appeared in 1922. The last will appear 102 years later. Jaguar has confirmed that the 2023 F-Type will be the last internal combustion-powered coupe or convertible the brand ever builds. The news is not unexpected. Last February, Jaguar announced plans to field an all-electric lineup by 2025.

Details on a Swan Song Edition in December Europe will get a special edition to say goodbye, called the 2023 Jaguar F-Type 75. It features gloss black wheels, black leather upholstery, and clever emblems behind the wheel arches that depict the F-Type's gorgeous silhouette. But that car may not come stateside in the same form. A Jaguar spokesperson tells us that a final edition will come for the U.S. as well. But details won't be available until December.

So, for now, the news is limited to the swan song.

If you've always yearned to own a sporty Jag, the 2023 F-Type is almost your last chance. It starts at \$73,400 (plus a mandatory

\$1,275 destination fee) and is available as a convertible or a hardtop coupe. Like all the best Jaguars, the thrills start when you look at it. It's one of the most gorgeous cars on the market. An active exhaust system lets you roar it for all the world to hear or nearly silence it at the touch of a button.



We don't know what will take its place in the hearts of Jaguar fans. The brand has one all-electric offering now — the I-Pace SUV — but it has been one of the slowest-selling electric vehicles on the market in 2022, in part due to its limited range (246 miles).

We would expect Jaguar to update its electric platform before attempting to sell its first electric sports car.

**At the time, Jaguar did business as the Swallow Sidecar Company. It used the name Jaguar for a trim level of its 1922 SS 2.5-liter sedan "sports saloon." The SS was one of the first cars to use the term "sports" in marketing material. But, as a sedan, it wouldn't fit into the sports car category by today's standards.*

It was well used as well, because the family estate car clocked up a healthy 70,000 miles with her more often than not taking the wheel herself. Now the former royal load lugger is to be auctioned, without a reserve price, this coming 26 November.



You will have seen it before, with photographs of the late Queen appearing in the press and indeed in snaps from members of the public, who would often spot Her Majesty in the grounds of

Sandringham or Windsor.

The question is, will it reach the same heady heights that we saw when Princess Diana's Ford Escort reached over three-quarters of a million pounds at the Silverstone Classic auction in August?

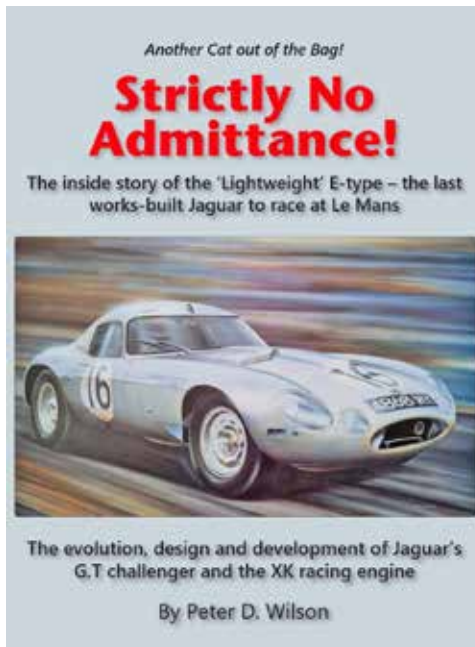

Jaguar book scoops accolade at Motoring Book of the Year Awards 2022

The Motoring Book of the Year Awards, hosted at the Royal Automobile Club, Pall Mall, seek to promote all book publishing about cars, motoring and motor racing. Now in its ninth year, there were winners in four categories in addition to the overall winner. One of those categories was for 'Best Motorsport Book' and this year it was awarded to:

Strictly No Admittance: The Inside Story Of The 'Lightweight' E-type The Last Works-Built Jaguar To Race At Le Mans by Peter D Wilson
Author Peter Wilson formerly worked in Jaguar's Competition Department and helped



to develop the legendary 'Lightweight' E-type. His remarkable recollections of those events is reinforced by the hundreds of hours he spent in the Jaguar Daimler Heritage Trust archives, and by many conversations with his former colleagues at Jaguar.

The level of detail is astonishing, and as judge Ben Horton said: "It's a definitive history of this period of Jaguar by someone who lived and breathed it."
