Driving Event Through Nantahala National Forest April 17-18

Pack your favorite lunch and drinks for our April 17th drive! We will be stopping along the way at a beautiful spot overlooking the lakes of Fontana.

We will meet at the Home Depot in Blairsville at 10:30 am and proceed south to route 129 and head towards Murphy, North Carolina. We will make a

short stop outside of Andrews and then onward to the Nanatahala Forest and a drive along the river towards Almond, N.C.

We will proceed north on route 28 up into the Smokies on a Jaguar friendly road with lots of twists and turns (my 71 E-type made this trip without problem) so enjoy the drive. We will be stopping at one of the many roadside stops for lunch and a break at 12:30 or so, after lunch we will proceed onward and upward to the Foothills parkway and then into Townsend, TN and the Richmont Inn. It should take about 3 to 3 1/2 hours (no rush). There are plenty of places for shopping and site seeing; the Tuskaleechee Caverns and a railroad Museum are right at our door. We will be dining at the Victoria Station which has a very nice menu from which to select your meal. There are several places for gas along the trip, but I would fill up prior to our entering the mountains. Note: For those coming from Atlanta who would like to convoy to Blairsville, Roy Cleveland will meet you at the intersection of GA 400 and Highway 60 (GA 400 terminates at Highway 60 which is near Dahlonega) at 9:15 am on Saturday morning. Our overnight stop for this drive is the Richmont Inn (1-866-267-7086 or www.richmontinn.com) which is in Townsend. 


