

The NGJC Cat Boutique was begun in 2007 by several women in the Club (see above) as a way to provide a fun, Jag-related, shopping experience for attendees at our annual Concours d'Elegance. It has proven popular and has grown each year. We wish to continue it.

Many items for sale at the Boutique are donated by club members but when we have needed funds to purchase quantities of items (tee shirts, visors, jewelry, etc.) or something special we have found or created (silent auction item), the Club has graciously advanced this money and we have paid it back and either broken even or made money on the items. NGJC has also allowed us to purchase a permanent sign for the boutique and has provided petty cash (always paid back) on the day of the Concours. We are grateful for the support the NGJC Board of Directors has shown to us.

We understand that it is very important that the Boutique organizers communicate clearly with each other and with the Board in regard to funding purchases and recognize there is room for some improvement in this regard. With this in mind, we offer the following for your consideration and approval:

(1) Annually the Cat Boutique Committee (CBC) will request the NGJC Board to approve a specified maximum amount for purchases they wish to make during the year. After the Board approves this amount, the CBC may submit reimbursement requests up to this specified maximum to the Treasurer for reimbursement.

- (2) All proceeds from the sale of items purchased and/or donated is to be returned to the club treasury.
- (3) Any purchased items not sold will be retained by the committee for future sales.
- (4) Any donated items not sold will be returned to the person who donated them.
- (5) The Cat Boutique is not to be involved with the sale of any vendor items not purchased by the Boutique or Club or donated to it.
- (6) The Cat Boutique encourages club members to find items they feel may be appropriate for sale. All such items must be approved in advance by the CBC in order to receive reimbursement.
- (7) The Cat Boutique will be allowed to advertise in the NGJC Newsletter and on the Club website under policy guidelines established by the NGJC Board of Directors.

We do respectfully request that you continue to work with us as we try to keep the Boutique "open" at future Concours.




