
Valentine's Celebration Sunday, February 10 Pearl Lian Restaurant 1 2:30 P.M.

The restoration of the XK 140 DHC was carried out over several years by Marvin and his son Marty to the point that they felt it was ready to compete for national JCNA Concours awards. To qualify for national honors in any JCNA Concours class the car must be shown and judged at least three times during the same calendar year. Marvin continued to correct the small judges' deductions after each show to arrive at a final average Concours score was 99.89. The XK 140's best score was a perfect 100.0 at the Tennessee show. Congratulations to Marvin, Carolyn, and Marty Sikes for a well deserved honor for their beautiful car.

I cannot say enough good things about the support that Hennessey Jaguar has provided our club. As of this writing there is still not a formal announcement of who will be the new owner of Jaguar. Because Ford Motor Company has insisted on selling Jaguar and Land Rover as a unit several buyers, who were only interested in Jaguar, have now dropped out of the bidding. At last report India based Tata Motors was the leading contender and Ford has entered into extended formal negotiations with them. What this holds for Jaguar is anyone's guess. It is my understanding that Tata Motors is the largest producer of motor vehicles and

heavy equipment in India and most certainly has the financial wherewithal to continue to infuse much needed new products into the Jaguar line. Joe Newell pointed out to me that Tata may really only want Land Rover as that brand has always been of prominence in India. Tata could then possibly sell Jaguar off again to someone who is solely interested in seeing that Jaguar retains its position as a premier offering in its marketplace.

Interesting but uncertain times indeed are here for our favorite marque. As with many historical events that we have all lived through it is difficult to determine exactly what is going on or how it will all turn out in the end. Only time will tell, but like all cats with nine lives I really do not believe Jaguar has used up all of theirs yet.

Dick Maury Takes Third Place in Final Standings for JCNA Concours Class 5

Dick's final score of 99.98 is 0.02 from a perfect score and reflects many hours of work correcting small deductions to bring his 1963 E Type OTS back to what it would have been like the day it first left the showroom floor. The Class C5 is by far one of the most competitive in JCNA Concours competition. The C5 class is for the series 1 E Type produced from 1961 through 1967. What makes this class so competitive is the wealth of information about the proper restoration of these cars. This, added to the current popularity of the E Type, has produced a large number of very good restored cars. Dick's is a rare 1963 model. What makes it so is the aluminum "cross hatch" pattern on the dash and center console. This particular "cross hatch" pattern was used for only one model year and, because of the small number of E-Types produced in 1963, is not being reproduced "as new" for use in restoration. Thusly Dick has had to revive forty plus year old original aluminum panels and that is not an easy thing to do for show purposes. Congratulations to Dick on this well-earned and deserved award.

It won't be long before the JCNA contingent of delegates and guests arrives at the Sheraton Station Square on the shores of the Monongahela River in Pittsburgh for the 50th AGM weekend.

If you're planning to attend, please arrive early on Friday, March 28 to take advantage of the 3:30 p.m. concurrent seminars of either "Originality Guide: Air Conditioning" hosted by Welsh Enterprises or an "Interview with Norman Dewis," famous Jaguar test driver, hosted by The Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh.

The "All Hands on Deck" call will mark the 6:30 p.m. boarding of the dinner and sightseeing cruise on the Keystone Belle hosted by Bobby Rahal Automotive Group. Our boat boards from the docks at Station Square, and our nautical adventure will take us on the city's three rivers, the Allegheny, the Monongahela and the Ohio. Norman Dewis will be on board for casual conversation, and the Belle's Captain has promised a gourmet dinner buffet during this private charter cruise.

The Captain's Dinner Buffet should please most any hungry land-lubber. It will feature mixed salad greens with Italian vinaigrette dressing, fresh fruit bowl, marinated mushrooms, hand-carved roast strip loin of beef, apricot glazed chicken breast, penne regatte pasta with tomato basil sauce, seasoned rice pilaf, glazed baby carrots with honey, brown sugar and pecans and an assortment of cakes.

Your banquet choice will be topped off, if you still have room, with cheesecake for dessert. (Keep in mind that the Sheraton has an indoor pool and a fitness center where you can work off that slice of cheesecake, so enjoy!)
