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
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## Caveat Emptor "Buyer Beware" Time for JCNA to Stand Up for Our Good Name

"Buyer Beware" has always been very good advice when purchasing a used car and now is even more important as the price of classic cars has risen to levels unheard of even a year ago. RM just listed the sale of a 1968 Jaguar OTS, SN 1E16228, Lot Number 75, for \$187,000 at their Scottsdale auction and many of us are familiar with this fabulous restoration by Classic Showcase in California. Now I have no problem that the seller got \$187,000 at RM when he flipped the car and I doubt that he cares a whit about the following incorrect information in the RM write up; Caveat Emptor after all. What I do have a problem with is when owners use JCNA's good name as the basis for promoting the sale of a car and fail to ensure that even the most basic information is correct.

For example the RM's promotional write-up for this car highlighted..."owned by a current JCNA Concours Judge". Bogus. The owner never even served as an apprentice judge and never completed the basic JCNA Judges Training. RM's promotional write up goes on to say that "the car was shown at the 2013 Jaguar Club of North America Concours at Chateau Élan at Braselton, Georgia, and was judged best in class". Bogus again. This car was not shown at our NGJC 2013 Concours period. (Our 2013 Concours was not even held at Chateau Élan and has not been since the 2005 Challenge Championship. The way this is written almost implies that the car was shown at the 2013 Challenge Championship which, by the way, was held in Richmond, VA). However, the owner could have pointed out that the car was shown in 2012 at our NGIC Concours in the Driven Division where it did take first place as it was the only car in its class.

RM's write up goes on and gushes that the car was used to train other JCNA Judges..."on how to properly assess an E-Type on a Concours lawn". In fact, the car was used at our 2013 Judges Training. Unfortunately it was used primarily to point out the numerous non-authentic items and other discrepancies on this example judges should look for if they encounter another 1968 OTS. As I understand it, Classic Showcase never intended the exceptional restoration of this car to comply with JCNA Champion Division or Driven Division standards and I hope the new owner is not too disappointed when knowledgeable JCNA judges point out that the car fails to meet many of these standards; Caveat Emptor after all.

Unfortunately, just because it says JCNA does not mean the information has been verified by JCNA. If JCNA is going to continue to be the recognized authority on Jaguars then it is time to start pointing out potentially misleading and inaccurate information every time we see it. Time to Stand Up and protect our good name.

Introduced before the advent of the second generation of Jaguar's brilliant E-Type, the aptly-named "Series 1½" E-Type combines the 4.2-liter engine and handsome body style with its predeces sor, while also incorporating many changes more commonly associated with its successor. These changes include twin Zenith-Stromberg carburetors, twin cooling fans, adjustable seats, and, most notably, open headlights. The car also includes four-wheel Dunlop disc brakes, with the rear discs fitted next to the differential to reduce un-sprung weight, and, most importantly, fully independent

This 1968 Series 1½ Roadster is in excellent condition following a restoration by the Jaguar specialists at Classic Showcase in Oceanside, California, which was completed in late 2011. Before it was refinished in its original color combination of Golden Sand with a Tan leather interior and Biscuit soft top, the car was striped to bare metal and every component was restored or replaced as needed. The results speak for themselves, and this E-Type is certainly of a very high caliber.

The car was shown at the 2013 Jaguar Club of North America Concours at Chateau Élan at Braselton, Georgia, and was judged Best in Class. However, its JCNA history does not end there. This car is presently owned by a current JCNA Concours Judge and has therefore been used as a sample car to train JCNA judges on how to properly assess an E-Type on a concours lawn, as it has received a high-quality restoration to original specifications. Additionally, it is noted in both its Jaguar Daimler Heritage Trust Certificate and the JCNA Judges' Manual as being the only E-Type of its kind to leave

Series 1½ E-Types are often considered to be the combination of the best of both worlds between Series 1 and 2 models. These E-Types beautifully utilize the mechanical updates that made the Series 2 E-Type more desirable, and they also retain the same basic looks that wooed the motoring Series 2 E-Type Initial desirable, and they also retain the same basic looks that wood the motorin world at the 1961 Geneva Motor Show, making it easy to see why these vehicles are desirable to Jaguar afficionados. This very special E-Type features a brilliant restoration, and it is confirmed by marque specialists at both the JDHT and JCNA to be matching its unique specification from when it left the factory. This 1968 Series 1½ E-Type is an excellent automobile to show or drive, and it is a splendid example of one of the finest cars to come out of Coventry.



## Hello Jaguar Enthusiast: Winter Market Update

The market analysts at Hagerty regularly track and report on more than three dozen collector car indices, one of which is the 10-car Jaguar index. Thanks to a 15% gain over the past four months, this index established a new high-water mark for the first time since its inception in 2006. This is the biggest move the Jaguar index has recorded during a single period since September 2009, when the index moved 15% in the opposite direction. The heavy lifting was primarily done by flat-floor Jaguars, which were hotly traded in the second half of 2013, prompting these cars' values to jump by 79%. Not to be overshadowed by those gaudy numbers, though, the group still posted strong gains with a 4% increase when the flat-floor's market adjustment is factored out. Jaguar XK120s, 140s, and 150s averaged a gain of 4%, and Series I and III E-Type convertibles both posted gains of 8%. Year over year, the index as a whole is 22% improved.

Curiously, the Jaguar index has largely been out of step with Hagerty's broader index of collectible postwar British cars during the past five years, but this most recent move positioned the two closer to parity. Hagerty's British Car Index has shown gains of 13% since 2008 and 23% since 2010. Hagerty's Jaguar index shows gains of 6% and 29% respectively.

In general, interest in E-Types is gaining considerable momentum following a sharp decline in 2009. The model's 50-year anniversary helped pull prices up in 2011, but what is really pushing prices at the moment is the recognition that these cars had become undervalued. Now that a handful of cars that have historically been less desirable than an E-Type or early XK are regularly exceeding \$200,000, it became a question of when sporting Jaguars would regain buyers' attention. At the moment, we appear to be seeing the answer.








## **Annual Valentine's Day Gathering**
