
**LETTER



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Jaguar To Go Racing With F-Type GT3?

Most British automakers have some manner of racing program. Aston Martin, Lotus and McLaren race as a matter of course. Bentley recently got back into racing, Morgan has dabbled here and there, even Land Rover has its off-road racing programs. The only one, it seems, that isn't racing these days is Jaguar... but that could be about to change.

The latest intel from the UK suggests that Jaguar is closely evaluating the prospect of building a GT3-spec racer based on the F-Type. Like the Bentley Continental

GT3 co-developed with M-Sport (not to mention Coventry's own successful partnership with TWR), the Jaguar program would need an established racing outfit to help develop the car and field it, and the automaker is said to be evaluating three potential partners.

The development of the GT3 racer would allow Jaguar to compete (or sell cars for others to compete) in a variety of racing series around the world, including the Blancpain Endurance Series, the European Le Mans Series and, if properly adapted, other series like the

United SportsCar Championship and the 24 Hours of Le Mans. Jaguar's car would have to compete with such rivals as the Aston Martin Vantage GTE, Audi R8 LMS, Ferrari 458 GT, Mercedes-Benz SLS AMG GT3 and Porsche 911 GT3 R.

Current FIA GT3 regulations use a Balance of Performance equation that allows for a curb weight between 1,200 and 1,300 kilograms (2,645 to 2,866 pounds) and produce between 500 and 600 horsepower. A more cost-effective GT4 racer could



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These Numbers Terrify Automakers

The percentage of young people with a driver's license has plunged during the last several years, according to a new study by the University of Michigan's Transportation Research Institute. In 2008, for instance, 65.4% of 18-year-olds had a driver's license. Now, 60.1% do. The trend has been underway for decades but seems to have intensified since the recession that began at the end of 2007.

In all age groups from 16 to 69, the percentage of Americans with a license has fallen since 2008. Above 70, it has inched up from 78.4% to 79%.

Auto sales have been strong during the last few years, hitting record levels in 2015. Analysts expect a slight increase in sales for 2016, for another record year. But that may be largely due to pent-up demand among consumers who put off buying a car when the economy was weak and are only now catching up.

Fewer licensed drivers, meanwhile, portends fewer car buyers in the future -- a problem General Motors (GM), Ford (F) and the other big automakers are all aware of. Technology is part of the reason: Smartphones and social networks now provide a sense of connectivity that the automobile provided before the digital revolution. And they're way cheaper.


More people these days live in cities, where cars are often more hassle than they're worth. Many millennials lack the cash for such a big purchase anyway, since the job market for twenty-somethings is still soft and the average student-debt burden is near a record high. And many millennials who do drive prefer leasing over buying, since

there's no down payment and you can upgrade your ride more often.

More than 90% of people between 45 and 69 drive, which means car sales probably aren't about to fall off a cliff. Cheap financing and easing credit help. But automakers are also racing to get ahead of demographic trends by investing in businesses that provide an alternative to car ownership.

GM has invested \$500 million in ride-share company Lyft, and it just purchased the remnants of a bankrupt competitor, Sidecar, for \$39 million. Ford is experimenting with a Zipcar-style car-renting program in a handful of cities and is reportedly teaming with Google on a self-driving car project. And most automakers are partnering with tech titans such as Google (GOOGL), Apple (AAPL) and Microsoft (MSFT) on new software that syncs the car's entertainment system with smartphones, allowing drivers to bring many of their favorite apps into the cabin and use them straight from the dashboard.

Automakers, nonetheless, are still dogged by worries that Peak Auto is upon us and it's all downhill from here. Shares in GM and Ford have flatlined during the last two years—despite record sales and strong profits—with investors concerned there's no growth ahead for car companies. It doesn't help that emerging markets such as China and Brazil are wobbling, too. There's no shortage of young people in the world, but there may be a shortage of young drivers.

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Select Winter Auction Results

Here is a wrap up of some of the 2016 Barrett-Jackson Auction results in Scottsdale, AZ that may be of interest to some club members:

Jaguar E-type '61 OTS, lot # 1368.1 show car sold at \$440,000.

This was a 100 point, outside latching bonnet, flat floor, welded-louver, early 1961 car restored to perfection and representing the top of the Marque.

Jaguar E-Type '67 OTS lot # 1325, restored and having 73,500 miles, with a very poor paint job sold at \$107,800.

Jaguar E-Type '65 OTS "custom convertible", lot #1325, with Corvette LS3 motor and 4-speed automatic trans. sold for \$77,000.

Jaguar E-Type '68 series 1.5 OTS, lot #1401, restored, sold for \$93,000.

Jaguar E-Type '73 OTS series 3 V-12, lot #1402, restored, sold for \$77,000.



Then there were some more interesting results at the Gooding auction:

1966 Jaguar E-Type Series I 4.2-Litre OTS (Chassis: 1E12582, Engine: 7E 8144-9) sold without reserve for \$385,000.

The presentation of this original and unrestored Series I Jaguar E-Type is a credit to its first caretaker, William B. Means of Metamora, Michigan.

The E-Type Mr. Means ordered was manufactured on February 11, 1966, and finished in the striking color combination of Pale Primrose Yellow with black leather upholstery and a black soft top. On February 21, 1966, the completed E-Type was dispatched and then sold through Jaguar Cars New York to Falvey Motor Sales, a British car specialist in Detroit, Michigan. As delivered to Mr. Means, the Jaguar was outfitted with Dunlop Road Speed tires and an optional Blaupunkt radio.

Mr. Means was, primarily, a collector of antique automobiles, and drove his E-Type Roadster infrequently – as Michigan weather allowed. When Jaguar announced that it would be discontinuing the E-Type, Mr. Means decided that his low-mileage Series I model had potential as a future collectible and prepared the car for extended static storage. Last registered in 1973, this 7,500-mile E-Type had been sitting for over four decades and, today, presents as a time capsule in virtually new condition.

1961 Jaguar E-Type Series I 3.8-Litre OTS, Show-Quality Restoration sold for \$260,000.

1955 Jaguar XK140 MC Roadster, sold without reserve for \$137,500.

1967 Jaguar E-Type Series I 4.2-Litre Fixed Head Coupe, Sold Without Reserve For \$107,250.

1966 Jaguar E-Type Series I 4.2-Litre OTS, sold without reserve for \$220,000.

1965 Jaguar E-Type Series I 4.2-Litre OTS sold without reserve for \$192,500.

follow. But the best part is that Jaguar could, according to the report in Autocar, develop a road-going version as well, even more focused than the Project 7 pictured above and similar to what Bentley did with the Continental GT3-R.

Jaguar of course has had a rich history with motor racing, reaching back to its dominance at Le Mans in the 1950s with the C-Type and D-Type, extending through

the TWR partnership in touring car and endurance racing in the 1980s and 90s, to the short-lived Formula One team that became Red Bull Racing. It launched a GT2-spec XKR a few years ago and was tipped to be developing a new LMP1 prototype, but neither are on the track today, where Jaguars only compete in vintage racing.



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The program is intended to be permanent, but eligible vehicles and amounts will be examined quarterly and adjusted as necessary. This will ensure that as inventory is exhausted and new cars are launched, the program will apply to the Jaguars currently available.

Watch your mailbox. Jaguar will send all eligible JCNA members a letter to announce the program. The letter will include a certificate number denoting your eligibility.
