

#### PRESIDENT'S **LETTER**



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# US News & World Report Ranks Jaguar XJ In Top Ten Luxury Cars

From US News Report

The 2014 Jaguar XJ ranks in the top 10 Super Luxury Cars. This ranking is based on our analysis of published reviews and test drives of the Jaguar XJ, as well as reliability and safety data.

The 2014 Jaguar XJ's athletic handling and powerful engine choices impress auto writers, but they say the XJ falls short with a tight back seat and frustrating tech features.

The XJ comes standard with a supercharged V6 engine and an eight-speed automatic transmission, and test drivers say that the base XJ will please most



shoppers with its quick acceleration and ample power. Reviewers also approve of the Jaguar XJ's eight-speed automatic, which they note is smooth and refined in normal driving situations, and quick to react when more power is needed. More-powerful supercharged V8 engines are available in Supercharged and XJR models. The 2014 XJ gets up to 18/27 mpg city/highway, which is good for a six-cylinder super luxury car. Critics

love the XJ's agile handling and accurate steering, noting that it drives like a much smaller car. While a handful of reviewers write that the 2014 XJ rides more firmly than some of its competitors, they also say that it's still comfortable and composed over imperfect roads.

Reviewers think that the 2014 Jaguar XJ has an attractive cabin design and top-notch materials that include leather, wood and aluminum trim. However, some reviewers report that the XJ's interior lacks the exceptional build quality found in competitors like the Audi A8 and Mercedes-Benz S-Class. The Jaguar XJ's

front seats are generally considered comfortable and supportive, though some auto writers note that the back seat is less spacious than those in other cars in the class. Critics note that audio, climate and navigation functions can be difficult to access through the XJ's touch-screen display, which can be slow to respond to user inputs. The XJ comes standard with soft-closing doors, heated front and rear seats, a power trunk lid, front and rear parking sensors, a backup camera, a

blind spot monitoring system, navigation, a 14-speaker Meridian audio system, a USB port, Bluetooth, satellite and HD Radio and an 8-inch

touch-screen display. Options and features available on higher trims include adaptive cruise control, four-zone automatic climate control, ventilated front and rear seats, reclining rear seats with massage, a rear-seat entertainment system and an upgraded stereo system.

"The XJ offers uniquely eye-catching style, a high-fashion interior and a driving experience that's more sport sedan than limousine. It's as alive and dynamic as its competitors are cold and calculating." — Edmunds

"The 2013 Jaguar XJ still boasts tasteful, minimalistic luxury, but its once-standout drivability has lost a step, and reliability issues should concern anyone looking to buy rather than lease one." -- Cars.com (2013)

"We're certain there will still be plenty of takers for the higher-level XJs such as the 510-hp Supersport with its optional Speed Pack, or the hyper-exclusive Ultimate and its over-the-top interior. But the six makes an unquestionably strong case for itself as the entry-level car, and as the only engine option available with all-wheel drive, it's likely to get more than its share of takers, in Britain and over here with us Yanks." -- Motor Trend (2013)

# Barrett Jackson Kicks Off 2015 Auction Season 2014 Saw Record Prices for Jaguar E-Type

As the 2015 auto auction season ramps up with auctions in Scottsdale and Phoenix in January, what will the future hold for classic car prices? One thing we know is the trend looks to be up.

UK web site This Is Money reports that soughtafter classic cars have soared in value in recent years according to a specialist underwriter, with motors from the 1950 and 60s having the most uplift. They claim E-type prices have tripled in a few years and that prime E-Type Jaguars have become unaffordable for many classic car buyers

Alongside classic cars, there has also been strong growth in fine art as people move away from volatile gold, according to Lloyd's of London based White Oak Underwriting Agency,

The classic car market is robust and is proving a popular alternative investment for higher net worth clients, the firm says.

Patricia Watling, the company's jewelry and fine arts underwriter, said: 'We keep a watchful eye on market developments, and both fine art and classic car values are doing very well.

'But we are aware that gold, traditionally a core holding for high net worth clients wanting additional investments outside of standard investments, is volatile.

'We are seeing very high prices achieved at classic car auctions for exclusive marques such as Ferrari and Aston Martin, especially cars from the 1950s with racing provenance and in exceptional original or restored condition.

A 1962 Ferrari 250 GTO serial number 3851GT sold at Bonham's Quail Auction on August 14, 2014 for US \$34,650,000.00 (\$38,115,000.00 including buyers

premium), breaking the record previously held by a 1954 Mercedes-Benz W196R race car, sold for a record \$30 million at an auction in England on July 12, 2013.

While collectible cars have been sold privately for more, this is the highest price ever paid for a car at a public auction.

Several story lines developed at the Gooding & Company auction near the Lodge at Pebble Beach.in August. First, three regal E-types roadsters were displayed; interestingly, each with a body color matched hard-top. One of the cars, chassis 875038, sold later for a world record \$528,000! The other two Series I cars sold at over \$200,000 as well. The bar has definitely been raised with the very early flat floor, outside lock, welded louvre models at the top of the heap. Two XK120 coupes followed another recent trend. A highly restored and near perfect car, chassis 680887, sold for \$121,000 while a less than 15,000 mile unrestored car went for \$181,500. Finally, a late model XK150 coupe, restored to perfection and sporting the highly desirable 3.8 liter engine, sold at \$137,500, possibly a record for a non-S car.

Meanwhile in downtown Monterey: RM auction. Again the explosion in classic E-type prices continued to play out; chassis 875331, another flat floor, outside lock,

welded louvre car sold at \$440,000. Chassis 1E12009 brought \$324,500. Two 1961 XK150 DHCs, restored to perfection came up for sale. Chassis 838664 sold for \$220,000 and chassis 838630, a car that had won its class in 11 shows and scored 4 perfect 100s in JCNA judged events, was bid to \$240,000, which the owner turned down. In the main lobby a 1967 Ferrari 275 GTB/4, purchased new by Steve McQueen and delivered to the set of Bullitt during filming; sold a day later for \$10,175,000.

The above mentioned record setting E-Type broke another world record set the previous November at the RM and Sotheby's Art of the Automobile auction in Manhattan. Perhaps one of the most talked-about sales from the event went to a car that didn't even break the top 10, but still managed to set an auction record: the 1966 E-type Series I 4.2-Liter Roadster that sold for \$467,500, including buyer's premium.

Delivered new on December 23, 1965, the Jaguar E-type

offered at the RM sale was billed as one of the finest examples in the world. Equipped with both the desirable covered headlamps and the more powerful 4.2-liter engine, rated at 265 horsepower and 283 pound-feet of torque, this late Series I production example was described as numbers-matching, and remained in the original owner's family for 45 years. Following the sale to its second owner, and showing just 71,000 miles on the odometer and wearing its original paint and interior, the car was delivered to Classic Showcase for a thorough restoration.


The net result, dubbed "Black Beauty," has been a success on the show circuit, racking up three perfect 100-point scores at Jaguar Club of North America events and earning the title of JCNA National Champion. The Jaguar took a class win at the Dana Point Concours d'Elegance and at the Desert Classic. Perhaps most indicative of the car's quality, it was shown with Jaguar's corporate display at the 2013 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance.

Watch your mailbox, Jaguar will send all eligible JCNA members a letter to announce the program. The letter will include a certificate number denoting your eligibility.

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
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
