Jaguar Appoints Philip Koehn as new Managing Director By Jake Boxall-Legge, Autosport

New Managing Director of Jaguar has Rolls Royce credentials

Philip Koehn has been in a leading role at Jaguar for a little while now, so this move represents a promotion from within. He joined from Borgward, a German/Chinese brand now consigned to history, in 2019. His appointment to a senior role to focus purely on Jaguar, no doubt applying his significant prowess and



experience that earned his reputation as an engineering genius at Rolls Royce, is a significant step towards the goal of Jaguar to become an all EV luxury brand within 3 years.

There is, as yet, no indication of who is to be named CEO of Jaguar Land Rover.

Phillip Koehn's LinkedIn profile states that he is "inventing the future of Jaguar" from his office in Gaydon – giving us a clue to the depth of changes currently underway at the brand.

Jaguar currently builds everything but the iPace and E-Pace in the Midlands and have already committed to keeping its factories and engineering facilities open past the magic all-EV date of 2025.

Having Philip Koehn, who is someone who worked positively with a British luxury brand like Rolls Royce in a way that celebrated its heritage and Britishness whilst not shving away from progress might spell a bright future for Jaguar.

Who Was Wacky Arnolt?

By Mike Gulett You may be thinking - but what is an Arnolt-Bristol?

In the early 1950s Stanley Harold Arnolt, also known as "Wacky" Arnolt, was an American importer of MG, Jaguar, Rolls-Royce, Aston Martin and Bristol cars.

He started making his own cars with a Bertone design based on the MG TD chassis. He made about 100 of these cars and he also had Bertone rebody six Aston Martin DB2s which were badged as the Arnolt-Aston Martin.

In 1953 Arnolt created a new model based on a shortened Bristol 403 sedan and engine with a beautiful body designed and made by Bertone. The chassis and the engine were based on the BMW 327 which Bristol had acquired the rights to after WW II.

The design of this new Arnolt-Bristol was modeled after the Bertone Alfa Romeo BAT designs which can be seen from the rear view. The bodies were steel with aluminum hoods and trunk lids.



There were three versions of the Arnolt-Bristol: the Bolide was the race model, the DeLuxe had a convertible top and side curtains, and there was a luxury coupe.

The Arnolt-Bristol had some success in racing with the highlight being at Sebring in 1955 where an Arnolt-Bristol finished first, second and fourth in class. Arnolt-Bristol quit racing for two years after one of their drivers, Bob Goldich, was killed in a race in 1957.

They did well again at Sebring in 1960 where an aluminum bodied Arnolt-Bristol won its class and came in 14th overall, another Arnolt-Bristol came in

fourth and the third car came in tenth in class. Arnolt-Bristol won the Team Prize that day. They had success in SCCA racing but soon shut down and the company was closed after the death of Arnolt in 1963. In total Arnolt-Bristol built 130 cars from 1954 to 1963.

Toyota President Says 'Silent Majority' Questions EV Ownership

Akio Toyoda speaks bis mind. Again. He doesn't mince words. From Carbuzz by Joe Traugott

Toyota president Akio Toyoda has, once again, publicly called into question the decision by several automakers to phase out internal combustion passenger vehicles in favor of pure battery electrics only. As a brief recap, the Toyota scion, lifelong car fan, and racing driver has previously called out the drawbacks of EVs, such as the necessary infrastructure required to support them and the need to acquire vast amounts of rare-earth minerals to build their batteries.



Speaking to The Wall Street Journal and

other media outlets earlier in Thailand, where an electric Hilux pickup was revealed, Toyoda clearly continues to express doubt about the exclusive use of EVs. Only this time he said that a "silent majority" shares his beliefs. They're just too afraid to speak out.

"People involved in the auto industry are largely a silent majority," he said. "That silent majority is wondering whether EVs are really OK to have as a single option. But they think it's the trend so they can't speak out loudly."


Who Was Wacky Arnolt?

By Mike Gulett You may be thinking - but what is an Arnolt-Bristol?

Some history on where he got his nickname...

Arnolt Corporation was founded in 1932 by Stanley H. Arnolt II (1907-1963) in Chicago with three employees, manufacturing automobile lubricating devices. During that time Arnolt developed an inboard marine engine called the Sea-Mite, which was one-third lighter than other engines of equal horsepower. On the thick foggy morning of September 26, 1938, with one of his engines affixed to a 13-foot boat, Arnolt left St. Joseph, Michigan and headed for Chicago.

Fighting waves and fog, he made the trip in four hours. Boatmen along Navy Pier shook their heads in disbelief, stating that he had more nerve than they did. He was greeted through the still thick morning fog with, "Hallo there, Wacky!". The headline of an



article that day in The Chicago Daily News read, "Wacky Comes Through in Fog; Crosses Lake in 13-Foot Boat"...and the nickname

stuck. Thereafter, he was known as "Wacky" Arnolt.

Toyota President Says 'Silent Majority' Questions EV Ownership

Akio Toyoda speaks his mind. Again. He doesn't mince words. From Carbuzz by Joe Traugott

Toyoda added that he continues to express these thoughts to governments and stakeholders. "Because the right answer is still unclear, we shouldn't limit ourselves to just one option," he added. General Motors and Honda are just two prime examples of automakers who have already set dates for the final phase-out of combustion-engined vehicles. Toyota, however, continues to invest in multiple powertrain technologies, specifically hydrogen fuel cell, hybrids, and plug-in hybrids.

The latest generation Prius was just launched, and potentially, more powerful versions could arrive later. The bZ4X EV is already on sale, and the RAV4 and Corolla hybrids continue to sell in very high numbers.

The hydrogen-powered Mirai is only available for sale in California.

Don't expect Toyoda's latest comments to spark any major industry changes immediately (if at all), but they serve as a reminder that internal combustion won't be leaving the scene anytime soon.

Last August, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) passed a plan that requires all new passenger vehicles sold in the state to be electrified by 2035. "Electrified," in this case, means either BEV or PHEV.

That's good news for Toyota and not placing all of its eggs into one basket, especially if battery material costs keep rising. It's impossible to predict the future, but with Toyota's business strategy, it'll be in a

better position to protect itself from potential industry, government, and supply chain disruptions.

NGJC member comments:

Wonder what would happen to the EV manufacturers if all the credits and subsidies went away? *-Roy Cleveland*Pursuing only, EVs, like Jaguar is doing is ludicrous and will prove to be a major mistake. The charging station network is not present or reliable, vehicles burn and burn hot and range is unreliable. I have NO interest in EVs of any make or model, car or truck. How excited can a true gear head be about driving a battery? *-Larry Kludt*
