For the most part, plan to remain at the zoo until at least 4:00 P.M. We will provide a car sign for each entrant such as is used for the concours to provide name and model of car and the friendly warning to look but not touch. Again, ALL PASSENGERS of any car placed on display will be admitted free but for the initial \$25.00 per car donation. Others who wish to attend this function and do not arrive in a Jaguar being displayed will be charged the children's entrance fee of \$11.50+ tax per person, discounted from the regular adult admissions fee of \$16.50+ tax per person. We will supply the zoo with a roster of members so that all adults in your party can receive the discount.

CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE – CHATTAHOOCHEE COUNTRY CLUB September 21, 2003

The Club's 2003 Concours d'Elegance will be held September 21, 2003 at the Chattahoochee Country Club in Gainesville, Georgia. The Chattahoochee Country Club is located on Lake Lanier just off Highway 60 which connects Gainesville and Dahlonega. The lake is full and looks beautiful this year making the location even better. More precise directions will be provided later.

We have arranged for a site convenient to the main clubhouse to be reserved exclusively for our use. There is a large covered pavilion adjacent to the car display area where members and entrants may relax in the shade. A brunch (heavily subsidized by Hennessy Jaguar) will be available in the clubhouse for our members and concours entrants. A private dining room facing the lake has been reserved for our use. The brunch will include the usual array of brunch type dishes as well as beverages and dessert.

This will be an officially sanctioned JCNA event and scores will count toward national standings. JCNA rules will be followed; therefore, there will be a Champion Division and a Driven Division. Registration fees are detailed in the registration form which will be available by July 21 and will be included in the next newsletter or mailed separately. All members are encouraged to attend even if you do not wish to enter your Jaguar. There will be a Display Only area for you to park and display your Jaguar if you only want to attend and observe.
