The biggest event of the year for JCNA will be held in Indianapolis beginning on July 31 – the

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

## SCCA Test Day at Road Atlanta July 20-22

The Sports Car Club of America is the backbone of American road racing, and the Atlanta Region is extremely active. Besides providing corner workers and other volunteers for events at Road Atlanta and across North America, the Atlanta Region also will host five events at Road Atlanta in 2007.

The biggest SCCA amateur sports car race of the season at Road Atlanta is the American Road Race of Champions, Nov. 9-11. More than 400 competitors

from 30+ states are expected to compete in the season-ending championship event.

Spectators are welcome at all SCCA events. A two-day spectator pass is only \$20 (children 12 and under admitted free) and parking is free except for the infield which is an additional \$5. 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## **Jaguar For Sale?**

The June 20th issue of AutoWeek printed an article that clearly indicates the Ford Motor Company is exploring selling Jaguar and Land Rover. After admitting that Ford had been using

investment bankers since the first of the year to explore the sale of Jaguar and Land Rover, John Gardiner, Ford spokesman stated. "We're not ruling anything in or out. We're investigating options in terms of all the possible actions." The AutoWeek article goes on to note that several automotive companies have already passed on pursuing the purchase of Jaguar. These include Fiat, Renault-Nissan, and Hyundai. During the middle of last year I had heard talk of a possible Jaguar sale to either Renault-Nissan or Hyundai but those

rumors proved to be untrue at that time.

What is driving this search by Ford to sell its Premier Automotive Group? Industry insiders believe that Ford's top management has lost confidence in Jaguar and Land Rover. Additionally Ford does not have the capital to develop new products for both its domestic market and the PAG. It is also noted that German auto maker Daimler's share price rose



dramatically with the unloading of Chrysler to a private equity company. Ford management is under pressure to improve its stock price and the sale of the PAG might help in this regard

as well as raise much needed capital for Ford's domestic market product development.

AutoWeek does note that... "The money to get Jaguar's striking XF sedan into production early next year is already allocated." However, both Jaguar and Land Rover are at the end of their current product cycles and "...there isn't enough cash to fund expansions of both British brands at the same time.'

The AutoWeek article goes on to note that this is not all a onesided affair. "There are plenty of Jaguar and Land Rover people

totally disillusioned with Ford's management of the subsidiaries in recent years. So the disappearance of Ford might be greeted with cheers, though tempered by worries about the venturecapital alternatives."

Jaguar has faced tough times before and survived to be a better company with exciting products. Hopefully this will be the case this time around.
