



Top Gear Reveals U.K.'s Favorite Cop Car: The Jaguar Mark 2

The burgundy Jaguar Mark 2 driven by Inspector Morse in the TV show Inspector Morse (Thursdays on Georgia Public Broadcasting Atlanta Channel 8) has been voted the most iconic TV cop-car of all time, in a new poll commissioned by the world's biggest motoring entertainment show, Top Gear.

The classic British-made model was declared top of the cops by over half (53%) of those surveyed, closely followed by Gene Hunt's Audi Quattro from Ashes to Ashes (43%), and the Ferrari 308 GTS that starred in Magnum, PI.

The Mark 2 epitomized Jaguar's motto of 'grace, pace and space', with almost a third of respondents identifying Morse's chosen crime-fighting vehicle as the ultimate TV cop car in terms of classic style and design.

Seven in ten of those polled declared the 1960s as the greatest era of iconic car designs. Though the Mark 2 actually launched in 1959, it was sold throughout the Sixties, with over 80,000 built in Coventry.

Alex Renton, Executive Producer of Top Gear comments: "It's fantastic to see the Jaguar Mark 2 claim top spot in the poll for the nation's favorite TV cop car. A true British classic that was a genius bit of casting which told you so much about Morse as a character. We were delighted to have the actual Jaguar Mark 2 from the show out on the track and to see the joy it brought to Chris Harris behind the wheel who is a Morse fanatic."

Chris Harris comments about his love for Morse's Jaguar in this week's episode: "The Mark 2 originally had a reputation for grace and sophistication but by the 1980's when Morse was on the TV, it had a different image, it was a bit more bank robber than stately home. But it all fitted with Morse's character, the curmudgeon and intellect who loved real ale and crosswords and disliked pleasantries. If a great TV police car can say something about the character or driver that almost no lines could, then this is the best of the lot"

Stellantis Warns Car Industry Will Collapse If Making Electric Vehicles Doesn't Get Cheaper

One of Europe's biggest automakers has warned that the industry is doomed unless electric vehicles get less expensive.

Stellantis is aiming to cut the cost of making electric vehicles 40 percent by 2030, chief manufacturing officer Arnaud Deboeuf said Wednesday. The producer of Fiats and Peugeots plans to manufacture some parts in-house and also pressure suppliers to cut the price of their products.

If EVs don't get cheaper, "the market will collapse," Deboeuf said at the company's Tremery factory in France. "It's a big challenge."

It comes as European Union countries this week endorsed a push to eliminate carbon emissions from new cars by 2035. With lawmakers in favor of giving up fossil fuels in the auto industry, it's highly likely that most manufacturers will have to shift to producing EVs in little more than a decade.

The company, based in The Netherlands, offers its products under the Abarth, Alfa Romeo, Chrysler, Citroën, DS, Dodge, Fiat, Fiat Professional, Jeep, Maserati, Ram, Opel, Lancia, Vauxhall, Peugeot, Teksid, and Comau brand names.

Meanwhile, Reuters reports:

World No. 4 carmaker Stellantis said on Wednesday it will speed up electric motor production at its factory in Tremery, France, long the world's largest diesel engine plant, to account for 50% of the facility's capacity by 2024.

In 2021, diesel accounted for 67% of production at this plant in northeastern France. By 2024, diesel engines will make up only 30% of installed capacity. Gasoline engines, also used for hybrid electric vehicles, will make up 20% of capacity. Via a joint venture with Japanese electric motor maker Nidec, Stellantis plans production capacity of 200,000 motors at Tremery by the end of 2021 and more than 1 million in 2024.

"It is quite symbolic to see this as our leading plant for starting e-motor production and transformation we face," Stellantis' Chief Manufacturing Officer Arnaud Deboeuf told reporters. Within the last decade, diesel accounted for more than 50% of European new car sales, but the technology has fallen out of favor as the European Union has focused on zero-emission cars.





First Jaguar C-Type Continuation Ready For Delivery, And You Can Still Buy One

Only 8 to be made to the same specs as the 1953 Le Mans-winner Jonathon Ramsey, Autoblog

Jaguar's XK120-C is known by its far more famous name, C-Type, known for winning Le Mans twice, and known for being the first car equipped with disc brakes to win a race in international competition. That latter victory happened on June 29, 1952, at the sports car race held ahead of the Formula II Grand Prix at Reims, France, with Sir Stirling Moss at the wheel. Wednesday marking the 70th anniversary of that win, Jaguar has chosen it to announce the first C-Type Continuation is ready for delivery.

This is one of eight continuation C-Types the English automaker announced in January 2021, all of them built to similar specification as the 1953 C-Type that earned

the model's second win at La Sarthe, meaning a 3.4-liter, 220-horsepower straight-six sporting three Weber carbs and disc brakes at the four corners. This one is finished in Pastel Green paint with Suede Green seats, recalling the car Moss raced in Reims the year before.

The Continuations are being built at the Jaguar Classic Works in Coventry, each needing 3,000 hours to complete due to using the same build techniques that went into creating the original cars. After the build, Classics engineers put each example through 250-mile shakedown. Once the run is complete, Jaguar said it planned to host a motorsports-themed celebration for the octet. Owners can enjoy plenty of other track days as well, the Continuations being approved by the FIA to run in all FIA Historic events. Owners won't need to worry about seeing their car everywhere, either,

since the C-Type is a rarity even with these additions; Jaguar only built 53 of the original.

Seems an undisclosed number of C-Type Continuations are still available to purchase. If visuals can sway any prospective buyers, Jaguar created a configurator showcasing the 12 exterior colors, eight leather hues, and two roundels that can be optioned. The carmaker hasn't mentioned pricing publicly, but it's thought to be north of seven figures.


