of the collection. Some vintage 16-millimeter films, but also VHS and Beta are included. Jaguar Clubs of North America, founded in 1958 was initially administered by the U.S. arm of the automaker itself, the archives have a full set of the Jaguar Journal, dating back to that era. Everything is being digitized, to preserve it for the future. Some of the more unusual items found are wooded plaques and tarnished racing trophies somehow saved through the years. Day to day duties include answering history focused media requests and doing the research required to create Jaguar Heritage Certificates. About three hundred Heritage Certificates are created per year for cars older than ten years. These are becoming more and more desirable to collectors and sellers to authenticate a matching numbers car. About ten percent of the collection has been digitized to this point. Jaguar Land Rover has shown a real commitment to preserve, protect and defend the assets

of the archives. They understand that if you forget your

history, you don't have a future.

XJ-220 Remembered 25 Years On

Development at first was to be a V-12 engine with all-wheel drive but because of weight issues Jaguar had to scale it down to a twin-turbo V-6 rear-wheel drive. This design delivered 542 HP from a 3.5 litre engine. Jaguar took some 1500 deposits of 50K pounds for the car after it was announced, but after the design changes only 271 cars ended up being built and delivered. It is believed there are only six in the U.S. now. Jay's conclusion is that the car was seriously misunderstood because of the engineering changes between introduction and delivery but that it is a seriously great car. Watch as they take it for a test drive . . .

Jaguar E-type found in hedge sells for £58,000



A Jaguar E-Type found under a hedge in the village of Bisley in Surrey (U.K.) sold at auction Wednesday evening (March 9th) for £57,900 (about \$82,500) including commission.

Although it was sold without a reserve price, the spiralling values of E-types meant that this 1963 example with only 44,870 miles on the clock was highly sought-after - despite requiring extensive restoration.

expired in November 1969. The early Series 1, 3.8-litre car is finished in Carmen Red with a tan interior. It is one of 1,799 right-hand-drive, fixed-head coupes built.

With an inline six-cylinder



engine developing 265 bhp, the car was capable of a top speed of 150mph and 0-60mph in less than 7 seconds.

The car's first owner in May 1963 was Ivor Arbiter, who designed the early Beatles logo with the dropped capital T to emphasis the "beat" part of the band's name. In November 1965 the car passed to SB Cain of Greenford, who sold it to garage owner Howard H Measham, who used it for a short period.

In December 1967 the car moved to its last owner, Frank Riches, who raced it between 1967 and 1969.

James Good, a valuer at auctioneer Coys, which sold the car, said: "This wonderful Series 1 E-type is in original condition, with matching numbers and has never been restored. It is ideal for restoration and is extremely rare. It has a great history, including racing, which collectors love."

The car was sold with its original brown log book, V5 and V5C, its last MoT certificate from November 1968, the sales invoice to Frank Riches for £855 along with a Jaguar heritage certificate confirming all the important details. It also has its original service handbook and manual, a spare parts catalogue and the original jack. It was sold at the Coys Spring Classics auction at the Royal Horticultural Society hall in Westminster.



Seinfeld Sells Some Porsches, VWs at Amelia Island

Veteran comedian pares down his collection at Amelia Island still has over 100 cars (and \$22 million more to play with)

Comedian Jerry Seinfeld, in a fit of spring cleaning, consigned a few of his old cars to an Amelia Island auction house last week. 16 out of 18 cars sold were Porsches, and almost all found new homes over the weekend courtesy of Gooding & Co. When the day was

over, Seinfeld's cars achieved \$22 million, with seven of them bringing seven-figure results.

The car-collecting comedian took to the stage to introduce the sale, held at the Gooding & Co. auction on Amelia Island, Fla. Seinfeld said he never bought cars for profit, but to enjoy and drive them. Now, he wanted other collectors to enjoy them.

"I wanted to be here with you all, who see these cars the way I do and enjoy this hobby the way I do," he said. "I wanted to see your face and feel your enthusiasm because that's why I do it. I never thought these cars were going to increase in value. I'm not a collector that gets cars to make money. I love the feeling of the car."

Some of the prices, however, seemed to exceed the enthusiasm of many of the bidders. The total haul for the auction was \$22.2 Million, short of the \$28 million

to \$32 million projected.

The top sale from Seinfeld's collection was a 1955 Porsche 550 Spyder, which sold for \$5,335,000. This rare 550 with coachwork by Wendler brought midestimate money, and was followed by the 1973 Porsche 917/30 Can-Am Spyder, which realized \$3 million. The Can-Am Spyder was actually estimated to bring \$5 million to \$7 million, though Seinfeld chose to cut that

one loose regardless.

In fact, a number of cars ended up trading hands below the auction estimate. Seinfeld's VW camper, which was used for his family's lemonade stand in the Hamptons before it was shut down by police last year, sold for \$99,000 — at the high end of the estimated range. But even a VW Beetle brought \$121,000, so we can't seriously say that the auction was a total letdown for the seller.


