Yellow Submarine and the Hippies were headed to San Francisco in their VW Micro buses. So, the following is a brief discussion to bring everyone up to speed on what our club intends to do on its first rally.

What is a Rally?

For our purposes a Rally is an event where the following information is provided to a team consisting of a Driver and a Navigator:

- 1. A set of CLEAR INSTRUCTIONS with the following information to drive from one point to another.
 - A. Road Names (Only those roads with clearly posted signs are used)
 - B. Direction to travel; (Left, Right, Straight)
 - C. Distance to travel (In miles and tenths; just like on your car's odometer)

- D. Speed to travel given distance (in MPH and never over the posted speed limit)
- E. The team's job is to calculate the time it takes to drive distances in the instructions and proceed at that pace.

Example: GO: Right on Hill St for 4.3 miles at 43.0 MPH to Stop Sign at Maple St. GO: Left on Maple St for 3.0 miles at 35.0 MPH to Stop Sign at Market S.

And so on to end of Rally.

- As noted above, only paved roads are used and posted speeds limits are always observed.
- 3. The Rally Master will determine specific check points to see how the various teams are doing against the ideal time that it should take them to travel that leg of the rally.



Typically, there will be two or three check points on a rally.

- 4. The object is to come as close as possible to the ideal time to travel a given leg at the specified distance, time and speed given in the directions.
- 5. Each leg is scored separately and the team with the best total score is declared the winner.

What do I Need to Bring?

The basic requirements are:

- 1. A clip board
- 2. Several pencils.
- 3. At least one watch with a sweep second hand (two watches are better and two stop watches are better yet). However, our rally can easily be run with a wrist watch that has a sweep second hand. Why two watches? One to keep time for the leg you are on and the other to keep the total rally time.
- 4. A car odometer that works.
- 5. A hand held calculator.
- 6. Yes, you can use the fancy navigational stuff that your new Jag has but it will not give you any advantage over the basics listed above and may in fact just get in the way.

How Difficult is the Math?

The math involved is really quite easy. Our Rally will only use one basic calculation. DISTANCE DIVIDED BY SPEED

Example: 4.3 miles divided by 43 MPH equals: 0.1 (one tenth of an hour) 0.1 times 60 (minutes) equals: 6 minutes and no seconds.

(That is how long it should take you to drive the 4.3 miles from Hill St to Maple St in the first example above) Example: 3.0 miles divided by 35 MPH equals: 0.086 (.086 of an hour) 0.086 times 60 (minutes) equals: 5 minutes and .16 of a minute 0.16 times 60 (seconds) equals: 9.6 seconds (round up for more than five) Total drive time is 5 minutes and 10 seconds.

(That is how long it should take

you to drive the 3.0 miles from Maple St. to

Market St in the second example above)

How Long Will Our Rally Be?

Right now our First Rally will be around 60 to 70 miles and take between one hour and a half to two hours. We will have two classes: (1) A Rally Class for folks who want only the directions and plan to do the math and (2) A Beginners Class for folks who want the directions and the math (times) also provided. Prizes will be awarded to the winners of each class. The real goal is to rediscover how much fun rallying over interesting roads in scenic country can be for old rally hands and first timers alike. Make plans to join everyone for our club's first rally on Sunday, June 26, 2005. The details are in a separate notice from Roy Cleveland and George Haldane, NGJC Rally Master. See you there!! 


