
NOTE: This dining room is not connected to their point of sale system; therefore, we will need to pay CASH.

The Pinehurst Concours d` Elegance, now in its' forth year, has truly come into its own with over eight thousand spectators enjoying a show field that featured exceptional Concours cars on one fairway and Club Car automobiles on the adjoining fairway on Saturday, April 30th. After all the Concours awards were presented everyone was invited to stay and enjoy an outdoor concert by the Commodores.

Friday's charity drive went to Fort Bragg in support of the USO. Numerous decorated soldiers were introduced to the gathering and rode along with the

car owners. A Jaguar XJ220 led the procession of over sixty classic and modern sports cars and was presented the Soldier's Choice Award at the Saturday Concours. Fort Bragg is home to the Army Paratroopers. Following lunch, we were treated to a demonstration by the Black Knights acrobatic Sky Diving

At Saturday's Concours James
Strickland's 1961 E-Type OTS not only
won it class but also received a highly
coveted HVA Award (the Historical
Vehicle Association is a very important
organization dedicated to documenting
and preserving historically significant
vehicles and James' number 6 E-Type
OTS is a very deserving recipient. The
award was presented by Concours Chief
Judge Nigel Matthews and Honorary Chief
Judge Ed Gilbertson (Chief Judge Pebble
Beach Emirates).

Ivan and Myrna Ruiz's Ferrari 246GT Dino, along with our good friends Karl and Linda Boegner, from Wolf Mountain Vineyards, 1988 Porsche 930 Turbo Cabriolet won Pinehurst Awards of Excellence. Dave Kirkman served as the lead judge for group 4 "European Open Cars". The Pinehurst Concours not only generates thousands of dollars for the USO, it also awards a two year scholarship to Sandhill's Community College to a local high school student interested in automotive technology.

### **Pinehurst Concours Organizers Laud What The Show Has Become**

"The quality and quantity of this field is comparable to, or greater, than those two," Ingram said of the Pinehurst Concours, which featured 100 cars in 13 judged classes. "We are so proud." Ingram said he and the other organizers aspire to create the same brand for the Concours here that Pinehurst has long enjoyed in golf. "We are on that trajectory," he said. Howard said it would be a challenge to overtake Pebble Beach, now in its 66th year, and Amelia Island, which just marked its 20th anniversary. "Our goal is to be the best No. 3 we can," he said. "You have to be patient. You have to manage your expectations. We made some changes last year."

In addition to the post-show concert last year, the event was condensed from two days to one. "Ticket sales tripled," Howard said. While much of that growth could be attributed to the Three Dog Night concert, Howard said the hope is more people will discover the cars. "They came and found out there was something else bigger going on, not just a concert," Howard said. "This is part of the education process."

Another educational aspect of the Concours is having 12 Moore County high school seniors to serve as student judges. They are assigned to work alongside the professional judges in each category. The Concours will eventually select one of them to receive a full scholarship from Sandhills Community College in automotive technology.

The Pinehurst Concours also has a strong military connection, something the other more established shows can't offer. The Iron Mike Rally is held the Friday

before the show. This year, about 50 of the cars lined up on Carolina Vista at the Carolina Hotel and made the 70-mile roundtrip to Fort Bragg to spend time with soldiers. Several soldiers rode in the cars in the caravan. Ingram said one of the highlights for him was having a Special Forces solider ride along with him. "This magnificent

guy, he is thanking me," an emotional Ingram said. "I should be thanking him."

The Concours
benefits USO of North
Carolina. Last year, it
contributed \$30,000
to the organization, the
single largest donation it
received last year. While
Ingram and Howard
would not disclose the
value of the cars in
the field, they said the
number of seven-figure
cars increased noticeably
from last year.

Howard said a 300 cars were on the field, including all of the special display cars. As

many as 180 cars — Porsches, Corvettes, Ferraris, Jaguars Mercedes and BMWs — from various clubs and organizations were in the Fairway Club.

Howard said it is unlikely the Concours will increase the number of cars in the judged classes. He said that seems to be about the right size for the show field. "Quality is always more important than quantity," he said. The Best in Show winners from the first three Pinehurst Concours were all on display. "These are



world-class cars," Ingram said. "All would win at other shows. These are collectors recognized around the world. All three have said this is their favorite show."

#### **Pinehurst Concours**

Bob Jepson Jr., of Savannah, Ga., whose 1919 Pierce-Arrow Model 66 A-4 Tourer won Best in Show last year, joined the latest top prize winner, Peter Boyle, on the lawn of the Carolina Hotel for the customary champagne toasts with all four cars lined up behind them — the "Pinehurst Concours Foursome."

"I'll toast Pinehurst any time," said Jepson, whose 1927 Isotta Fraschini Tipo 8-AS Dual Cowl won a Pinehurst Award in the Pre-War European (open and closed until 1942) class this year. "This is a wonderful show."

But it was Boyle's 1928 Isotta Fraschini that won the class and, ultimately, the coveted Best in Show Award.

That makes the Oil City, Pa., car collector the first two-time winner in the event's short history. His 1938 Steyr Roadster won Best in Show at the inaugural Pinehurst Concours in 2013.

"This has just been a terrific run for me since I first came to Pinehurst, and this just caps off that run," Boyle said. "This is a great show. I'm very humbled they chose me. It's a wonderful car. It's just beautiful on the road."

Boyle purchased the car — which has an ostrich-skin interior — in 2005 from Jim Thomas, himself a judge at the

2016 Pinehurst Concours. The vehicle was a late entry for the Concours, but it was nearly a no-show. Roger James, of D&D Classic Automobile Restoration that restored the car for Boyle, said they were loading the car on the truck the Tuesday before the show "and all of the sudden this big cloud of white steam came rolling out of the tailpipe. Then antifreeze was coming out of the tailpipe."

"We knew we were in serious trouble," James said. "All the guys, they desperately wanted this car to come, so they all volunteered, five guys, to stay overnight to pull that off. We had an extra head gasket. We got it repaired, all back together, and the next morning, we loaded it."

James joked that he has ordered two more head gaskets just to be on the safe side.

Boyle, who did not start collecting and restoring cars until 2005, said it took Rogers about two years to restore this car. "We went to Pebble and the rest is history," Boyle said of the car that has 12 of 13 Best in Show awards.

When asked how much it is worth, Boyle replied, "I really have no idea but I can tell you it's priceless to me."




