Official: First All-New Electric Jaguar Is £100k Four-Door GT

Jag's rebirth is imminent, first new car arrives next year Vijay Pattni, Top Gear

"This is unfinished business," JLR boss Adrian Mardell said. "Jaguar is going to be reborn."

And that rebirth begins with the first of three entirely new Jaguar electric cars: a four door GT with a starting price of £100,000.

Indeed. After a period of silence - acknowledged by Jag's senior team as necessary while they hashed out the storied British car brand's future - we now know something about how the Big Cat will 'purr again'.

It'll sit on a dedicated new chassis dubbed 'Jaguar Electric Architecture' - remember Jaguar will transition into an electric only brand from 2025 - that'll

underpin those three new cars, at least to begin with.

Jaguar is targeting an all electric range of 700km (430 miles) from the new GT's powertrain... and a lot of power. "This will be the most powerful Jaguar ever," CFO Lennard Hoornik told TG. Jaguar wouldn't confirm any specifics at this early stage, but we're assured horses will be PLENTIFUL.

Jaguar isn't building its own battery cells, but Mardell confirmed owner Tata - a "nurturing" parent - will be constructing a gigafactory

in Europe. Jag's already secured a supply.

Meanwhile Jaguar is investing £1bn, and will build these new electric cars in a bespoke facility in Solihull.

As to how this new Jaguar - indeed all three new Jags - will look? Creative boss Gerry McGovern said they will be "a copy of nothing". That's actually how Jaguar founder Sir William Lyons originally briefed his team as to what his company's creations should look like; to basically stand apart, not be a rival for, anything

on offer at the time.

There was a tacit admission that Jaguar's previous strategy of trying to compete in the mainstream perhaps wasn't the greatest success, so creatively the new generation will be 'modern, unique, exuberant'.

"When these new Jaguars appear for the first time, they need to have a jaw dropping moment," McGovern said. There was mention of making sure these new car designs 'shock'.

Rare Classic Cars Up For Auction After Huge 230-Vehicle Find

Car enthusiasts will be able to get their hands on a rare Lancia B24 Spider America next month when an impressive fleet of 230 classic cars discovered in warehouses and an abandoned church in Holland comes up for auction.

The hoard of classic vehicles, believed to be worth millions of euros, belonged to Dordrecht

businessman Ad Palmen, 82, who started collecting the cars 40 years ago, according to auction organizers.

Due to Palmen's reported ailing health, he could no longer keep the vehicles and they were recently purchased by Gallery Aaldering, a motor vehicle dealer run by Nico and Nick Aaldering, for an undisclosed amount.

"The Palmen Barnfind Collection' will go under

the hammer in the Netherlands from May 19 as part of an auction organized by Gallery Aaldering and Classic Car Auctions.

"This barnfind collection is truly a unique opportunity for car

enthusiasts and collectors around the world to expand their collection," said Nico and Nick Aaldering in a press release.

"We are very pleased to be able to auction these cars through Classic Car Auctions and look forward to seeing how much interest there is in this wonderful collection."



Carlo Te Lintelo, Gallery Aaderling's head of marketing, told CNN on Friday (April 14th) that Palmen's trove, which includes a white Mercedes 300 S convertible, a blue Ferrari 365 and a modest Alfa Romeo Spider, was a closely guarded secret until a fire broke out at his largest warehouse last year. A quick response from the fire brigade prevented the cars going up in smoke.

It is believed that Palmen has a deep appreciation for cars rather than a fondness for specific brands. Many of the models, including Maseratis, Jaguars, Aston Martins, BMWs and Facel Vegas, are in

pristine condition, Te Lintelo said.

"These cars are in a great



collecting cars like Mercedes Benz, Jaguar or BMW. Mr Palmen didn't collect just expensive or exclusive cars he bought everything he thought was beautiful," Te Lintelo said.

Many of the models, including Maseratis, Jaguars, Aston Martins, BMWs and Facel Vegas, are in pristine condition

He added: "This collection includes cars that are very special. Like the Lancia B4 Spider America. Just to give you an idea, that car alone will sell for €00,000 to €00,000 (\$660,000 to \$770,000). They are very rare, only a couple of them were made. If in perfect condition, they can sell for up to € million (\$1.1 million)."

'Cars were his life'

According to Te Lintelo, there remains many unanswered questions about the collection because Palmen is too ill to tell his story.

"We have hundreds of questions about why

he started collecting," Te Lintelo said. "So much mystery around the cars because he can't answer. [It's] very sad."

But there is one thing that Te Lintelo believes to be true: Cars were Palmen's passion. "He was living in the warehouse and not in a luxurious way. Cars were his life," he said. "We want to respect his legacy. This was his entire life. The Gallery Aldering brought the cars but we chose to name the collection after him to honor him."



Cornering Classic Cars

In two years, McKeel Hagerty has transformed his modest family business for vintage vehicles into a conglomerate with unprecedented control of the entire industry.

Every August, the world's most discerning car collectors descend on Carmel-by-the-Sea, California, for an unadulterated automotive orgy. The occasion is Monterey Car Week, where enthusiasts staying at four-nightminimum resorts arrive on dew-drenched hotel lawns in the early hours to ogle vintage Jaguars and Porsches. By afternoon thev'll cram into white auction tents to bid millions on the blue chips, a Mercedes-Benz 300 SL Gullwing or a Ferrari 250 GTO. Come evening, Bugatti, Lamborghini and Rolls-Royce will host candlelit dinners overlooking the yachts in Carmel Bay and offer VIPs private meetings with top-ranking car executives and sneak peaks of upcoming models. Flexiet parking is always on tap; the loafer and scarf count is high.

The week climaxes on Sunday at the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, a car show on the 18th fairway of the golf course. It's like a very fancy dog show, but for cars. As guests order seafood towers and sip Champagne, navy-jacketed judges inspect the purebreds


of the auto world: Alfa Romeos and Bentley Blowers decorated with liveries from races won last century; Duesenbergs and Packards with art deco fenders the size of card tables; Lamborghinis painted as bright as Skittles. The winner gets ribbons, a trophy, a bump in their car's value—and bragging rights.

This year brought with it an unusual addition to the upper-crust ranks: a Midwestern insurance company working hard to fit in. Auto brokers, nouveau riche collectors, restorers and retired racing champions gossiped near auction tents and late-night fire pits, noting that Traverse City, Michigan-based Hagerty Inc. had given itself a makeover.

On Wednesday, Hagerty hosted a gala at a local jet hangar. On Thursday its newly acquired Broad Arrow auction house took in \$55.3 million in total sales. On Saturday, it sponsored free food and drinks in a suite at Laguna Seca Raceway. On Sunday, it was Chief Executive Officer McKeel Hagerty himself, shaking hands near the winners podium. "They did seem to be everywhere during Car Week," says

Greg Fazzio, a Hagerty insurance customer who attended the festivities.

Recently, Hagerty—the man and the brand—has been on a tear. The company, founded in 1984 by McKeel's parents, has long insured classic cars and provided market data on their fluctuating values. In the past two years it's tried to trade in its humble image for something much more audacious—that of a conglomerate that owns every aspect of the collectible car universe, including auctions, brand experiences, data, events, logistics, media and storage. It's acquired half a dozen major car events nationwide, such as the intimate Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance in Florida and the exclusive California Mille rally. It's opened car storage clubs in Chicago, Los Angeles, Miami and five other cities. It's purchased a handful of auto-related tech companies, including the creator of a motor sports event management system and a tech provider, Speed Digital. It also operates DriveShare, a peer-topeer classic car rental service it bought and relaunched in 2017,



and runs an online classifieds section for 753,000 paying members. In recent years it began publishing Hagerty Drivers Club, a bimonthly magazine, and Radius, a quarterly distributed to top collectors.

Hagerty says that by cornering the market he'll save classic car culture, a loose term used to describe the disparate local groups of car aficionados scattered across the country and, these days, social media. It's a universe made up of an estimated 43 million collectible vehicles, whose values have risen more than 190% in the past decade, according to the Knight Frank Luxury Investment Index.

Hagerty says this culture is threatened by increasingly stringent transportation regulations and a declining interest in the more

traditional aspects of the hobby, like learning how to operate a manual transmission. As people become captivated with autonomous driving, he says, the network required to preserve old cars—brokers, collectors, curators, drivers, investors and mechanics—dwindles.

Those gorgeous old Bentleys and Jaguars with their rumbling engines and antiquated brakes are already so rare that seeing one drive a more diverse across a concours lawn is like encountering a Bengal tiger in the wild. If they're not protected and well cared for, Hagerty believes, this endangered species will go extinct. "I love the car world," he says. In 2014 he created the National Historic Vehicle Register to document important cars in America's past. "I really wanna see it last long term, but I don't think that's a given."

The industry has never witnessed a shake-up

The industry has never witnessed a shake-up like this. Hagerty's growing empire not only presents uncomfortable potential conflicts of interest, it also raises the question of whether the nation's 120-year-old classic car culture—rich with hundreds of tribes devoted to everything from American lowriders to Italian exotics—can maintain its diversity under an expanding corporation posing as its savior. "There is a terrific automotive lifestyle business being built before our eyes," says Donald

Osborne, an automotive appraiser, TV host and writer who worked as a consultant for Hagerty for a decade and hasn't been seen in public without a bow tie for years. "But what does that have to do with insuring collector cars?"

Hagerty believes consolidating the industry under its banner will keep America's car culture alive, even though it's not all that clear the culture needs saving. These days popular hangouts such as Lower Manhattan's Café Leon Dore are pulsing with Alfa Romeo and Porsche groupies, while coffee meetups from Malibu to Montauk are drawing teen and twentysomething car fans who spend their free time playing Gran Turismo and watching Netflix's docu-series Formula 1: Drive to Survive. Last year online auction platform Bring a Trailer—

half of whose users are 44 or younger, according to a company spokesperson—reported a record \$1.3 billion in sales of classic cars. Even auction sales of the oldest, most expensive classics are up, and increasingly popular with buyers under 50, according to Bonhams. "It seems like every show that I go to, it's starting to get a younger crowd, a more diverse crowd," says Bradley Brownell, a co-founder of Radwood who's now director of the Crawford Auto-Aviation Museum in Cleveland. "I just don't know that Hagerty is the one doing that."

At the 2023 Amelia concours weekend in early March, Hagerty's corporate fingerprints were everywhere. As 25,000 car enthusiasts rolled in, they received QR codes for entry, alerting them about

impending rain, scheduling changes and parking, while jumbo screens broadcast the awards ceremony across the main lawn. Meanwhile, old-timers grumbled they could no longer park freely along the country road leading into the concours, instead having to leave their cars in nearby fields for \$40 a day. Hurley Haywood, the retired American racing driver, expressed disappointment to anyone who'd listen that he had to purchase tickets to the opening dinner, when in prior years he'd attended for free. The vibe, as it were, has

shifted. "If Hagerty can bring corporate organization and financial support to events that might not exist, good for them, that's terrific," Osborne says. "On the other hand, I think it's important to understand why people participate in those events in the first place."

Under the title 'Project Renaissance', McGovern tasked his team to entirely reimagine what Jaguar looks like. Some 18 models were built by three design teams in a very short space of time. Indeed they're still finessing the final designs now.

There's been no mention of nameplates, nor what form the next two cars will take. When pushed by TG on one of the three new electric cars being a two-door, two-seat sportscar - part of Jaguar's DNA you'd argue - they wouldn't confirm.

A final note about badging, mind: there'll now be a 'house of brands' spanning Range Rover, Defender, Discovery and Jaguar. Each is its own brand if you will, McGovern noting how, for example, 'Land

Rover Range Rover' is a bit of a mouthful.

That said, Land Rover - a nameplate with a country tonne of heritage and equity - will underpin RR, Disco and Defender. So, glad that's cleared up then.

What was clear was Mardell and the senior team's passion about Jaguar's long-anticipated revival; about its Britishness and storied heritage. Mardell himself has been working at JLR for 32 years in a career spanning 19 roles, the most recent one at the very top of the tree... having started as an apprentice. So it means a lot.

"This is the beginning to put right unfinished business," Mardell said of Jaguar's all-electric revival. "This is personal."
