Annual Dues for 2004

The annual dues for NGJC for by December 15. We have to send a roster to JCNA with dues payments for each member on the roster in early 2004 so it is very important that we have all our dues collected before January 1. Of the \$45 that you pay in dues, NGJC pays \$20 to JCNA. If you were a member at large, you would pay \$28 for annual membership. In effect, it costs you only \$17 per year to be a member of NGJC (\$45 minus \$28) assuming you intend to be a member of JCNA. For this \$17, you receive a monthly newsletter, access to local events, a local club, and discounts from Hennessy Jaguar. We hope that you will decide that your membership has been worth its cost and will continue your membership for 2004. 
