

REPORT ON CONCOURS d'ELEGANCE

When there are so many Jaguars on site that you are not sure you have an accurate count, you know it has been a good day. We know that fifty-four Jaguars were entered in one of the four categories (Champion, Driven, Special or Display). Approximately one hundred are made each year. The People's Choice Award six people had lunch at the country club. We had participants from the Carolina Jaguar Club,

Jaguar Society of South Carolina, the Smoky Mountain Jaguar Club and the Jaguar Drivers Club Area 51 (Kentucky JCNA). We know that other Jaguars were there but their owners apparently came as spectators.

We had ten XKs (at least four members have cars undergoing restoration and two others couldn't attend with theirs), ten E-Types and several superb examples of the XJ-S, XJ, XK8 models. Cliff Price had

his beautiful Mark 2 there as was Joe Newell's gorgeous Mark IX. and Mike Fulton's immaculate 1938 SS 1.5 Litre Saloon.

Several cars were making their first appearance—among them was Jeff Small's 1957 XK140 roadster which arrived from California only days before. Jeff's car received the second most votes for the People's Choice Award. Buzzy Turner's very well-done D-Type replica made its initial appearance at our event. Perhaps the most unique car at the event was the XJ220 owned and driven to the event by Ron Green. This was the factory demonstrator car and was subsequently owned by Win Percy, a well known British racing driver, and Terry Larson, a well known U.S. collector and restorer of C and D Type Jaguars. This is believed to be the only XJ220 in Georgia and it is believed that there are only a few in the United States. We found out during the day that Dianne Hulsey had actually ridden in this car at Castle Combe in England in 1998 during her and Terry's attendance at the XK 50 celebration. Ron has graciously invited us around 10%.

AUTOMOBILE MAGAZINE 100 COOLEST CARS




