
We'll all meet in Convers at 10:00 am at the

Governor Jenkins purchased the almost 12,000 square foot house in 1854 to better entertain his various



political contacts. Mr. Crowell purchased the house in the early 1900's and planted extensive, the overpass and the IHOP is on the right next to formal, English gardens, making Green Court one of the homes of that time that earned the City of Augusta its' designation as the "Garden City".

For those of you that are golfers, there River Walk with its many interesting shops, restaurants, etc, are also of interest. Sightseeing can take place on Saturday afternoon and on Sunday morning before we head back to Atlanta.

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



Elsewhere in this issue is a listing of all of the members who volunteered or made a contribution to the success of this event – the first CC ever held in Georgia.



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
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
