British Car Fayre Successfully Dodges Bad Weather





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Peugot Wins Wet Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta

The car made its first on-track appearance on Friday morning completing three demonstration laps followed by the opportunity to go out for another lap in the afternoon. A final session was scheduled on Saturday morning to give the race day crowd one last look, but heavy rains lead to the cancellation.

"This weekend was all about the unveiling of the Jaguar XKR GT2 race car," said RocketSportsRacing

team owner Paul Gentilozzi. "We came out here to do just that. We decided to take advantage of running some demonstration laps as a shakedown and to give the fans and all of our supporters the opportunity to see the car. We decided that we didn't want to rush into things and put ourselves at risk doing our first laps in a timed session. We have planned for private testing this week in preparation to race the car at Laguna Seca, the ALMS season finale en route to our full season effort in 2010."

Upon completion of the on-track session this weekend, Gentilozzi commented, "We are pleased with the performance of the Jaguar XKR. We didn't expect any surprises with the car, and we didn't have any. It went very smoothly.'

From a production car, the Jaguar XKR makes an excellent racecar. "The Jaguar XKR is exceptionally strong and rigid, and the construction method is in advance of the conventional steel stamping that we see in cars today," explained Gentilozzi. "That allows RSR to build a lighter,

stronger, stiffer racecar. Also, the basic aerodynamic design of the XKR has a low drag coefficient and more than sufficient downforce."

Gentilozzi was behind the wheel during all demonstration laps, but right by his side during the runs was announced development program drivers Scott Pruett and Mark Goossens. Both drivers were impressed by the car and look forward to their opportunity to get behind the wheel and aid in its development.

"The thing that has been most exciting for me is seeing the passion behind Jaguar; the passion from the Jaguar executives that were here this weekend to Page 4

appreciated that because I drove for Jaguar in the past. I think that sometimes you forget when you are so close to things just how much passion is behind that marque. It is just great and to be a part of this program is exciting. Now with that being said, it also comes with a pretty high standard to be held, one that RSR and Paul Gentilozzi will embrace and one that I am excited to

The decision to call the race prior to its completion was required for the following reasons...

Due to the weeks of historically unprecedented inclement weather that the Greater Atlanta area had been subjected to (including additional very heavy rain Saturday morning) the track conditions at the start of the race were fragile at best. The land surrounding Road Atlanta was completely saturated and incapable of

> absorbing any additional rainfall. The heavy rain that began just before the halfway mark of the race almost immediately created an unsafe condition on the track. There were several areas with water running across the track and standing water up to 6 inches in depth in the Turn 4 and Turn 10 areas. These conditions required IMSA to halt the race per the published red flag procedures.

The winning Peugeot's two diesel-powered factory prototype coupes finished 1-2 with the polesitting 908 HDi of Pedro Lamy and Nic Minassian in second. The first of Audi Sport Team Joest's Audi R15 TDIs placed third, the car driven by Allan McNish and Dindo Capello.

McNish and Capello dominated the race before the rains fell. The two Peugeots got past McNish under yellow when the Scot looped the Audi under wet conditions.

Dyson Racing took its first Petit Le Mans victory with a victory in LMP2 for Marino Franchitti, Butch Leitzinger and Ben Devlin. Their Mazdapowered Lola B09/86 coupe had problems

with gear selection early, but the Acura ARX-01b of Lowe's Fernandez Racing's Adrian Fernandez and Luis Diaz experienced steering issues throughout. Nevertheless, the duo completed enough laps to clinch the team championship for Lowe's Fernandez and the manufacturer championships for Acura.

Risi Competizione's Jaime Melo, Pierre Kaffer and Mika Salo won in GT2 in their Ferrari F430 GT, the fifth straight endurance victory for the team. A brilliant call by the team made the Ferrari the first GT2 car to take wet tires, and Salo drove past the rest of the field into the lead.

Goossens added, "I am proud to be part of the program. The car looks very good. 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


