## Jaguar E-Type Roadster Achieves New World Record At Auction

A '61 Series I 3.8 Roadster sold for \$1,145,000 but wasn't the most expensive car sold at Gooding & Company's London Auction.

Prestigious auction house Gooding & Company has released the sales results from its London Auction, and the numbers are impressive.

A new world

record for production E-Types was achieved after a 1961 Series I 3.8 Roadster sold for £911,250 (approx. \$1,145,000). This particular Jaguar is extremely special, the fourth right-hand-drive E-Type Roadster ever built. Adding to its provenance is that Jaguar director and Le Mans team manager Frank England once owned it.

We wonder if the E-Type Roadster will hold this record for long. At the same auction, Gooding & Company presented the first-ever E-Type Fixed Head Coupe, estimated to sell for as much as \$1.77 million. For that much money, one could purchase nearly 16 examples of the F-Type Coupe R75.

Unfortunately, the E-Type FHC remains unsold, but we don't expect it to sit around for much longer.

While the E-Type Roadster brought in a hefty amount, it can't match the other high achievers from the London Auction.

A stunning 1954 Ferrari 250 Europa sold for a staggering £1,518,750 (approximately \$1.9 million), and, like the Jaguar E-Type Roadster, it has an incredible backstory. Delivered new to Clarence Leon Brown - the Hollywood director behind 1944's The White Cliffs this Pininfarinadesigned beauty worth every penny of its massive sale price.

But a desirable German beauty managed to attract even more money. A 1962 Mercedes-Benz 300 SL Roadster exceeded all expectations, selling for more than its estimate. Someone paid £1,800,000 (roughly \$2.26 million), and it's clear

to see why. The original Ivory paintwork, red leather interior, and black hardtop underscore the beauty of this Teutonic titan.

The biggest sale of the day was the 1953 Ferrari 166MM/53 Spider. Owned by an enthusiast for 63 years, the Vignale-bodied Italian sold for a staggering  $\pounds 2,531,250$  (around \$ 3.2 million), which is an incredible amount of money for a car, rare classic or not.

A 1952 Aston Martin DB2/4 Indiana Spider was also up for grabs, and we're surprised it didn't sell, especially when you consider it's a one-of-one creation. This is one for the wealthy collectors with an estimated sale price of \$1,525,000-\$2,300,000.

Recently, Gooding & Company presented a special Lagonda LG45 Rapide at the Pebble Beach Auction. The vehicle was expected to sell for as much as \$1.2 million but ended up attracting slightly less, at \$1,055,500. Considering how classic car values are on the rise, we don't doubt these records will be overtaken sooner rather than later.

# As The Neighborhood Changes, Harvard Square's 'Dewey, Cheetham & Howe' Window Lives On

The sign survived a recent renovation, and will continue to overlook the square indefinitely — living on as one of the area's most beloved landmarks. By the early 1990s, big things were happening for the Magliozzis' little radio show.

"Car Talk," the call-in program the Cambridge brothers launched on WBUR in 1977, had gone national, and their blend of good-natured humor and expert advice on car troubles was garnering attention far beyond Boston.

So they wanted to look the part--sort of.

"My brother and [producer Doug Berman] thought we needed a pricey office in Harvard Square to show that we were a real, serious entity," said Ray Magliozzi, who co-hosted the

show with his brother, Tom, for 35 years. "We knew we weren't, but we wanted to at least make people think we were."

In 1992, the same year they won a prestigious Peabody Award, they leased space on the third floor of 5 John F. Kennedy Street, overlooking the square; set up a table and a handful of folding chairs;

and established the "Car Talk" global headquarters.

Among the first orders of business, of course, was cracking a good joke. For its window, they hired someone to install authentic gold-leaf lettering like you'd find outside a respectable law firm. But instead of using their own names, or that of their popular program, they had a lawyer pun spelled out: "Dewey, Cheetham & Howe."

It's been there ever since. In its many years

watching over the eclectic neighborhood, the sign has



"Car Talk" fans will recognize the wordplay on the window as part of a long-running bit on the show, when listeners were told to submit answers to weekly "Puzzler" questions via letters addressed to the fictional law firm. It was one of countless other groan-inducing and name-based puns the brothers would rattle off at the end of each show.

While they can't take credit for the joke on the sign — Magliozzi admits they lifted it from "The Three Stooges" — the brothers may have gotten more mileage from it than the comedic trio ever did.

Magliozzi and Berman still remember the day the sign was put up. While the installer, an older man, worked quietly at the window, the Magliozzis and Berman were putting together a newspaper column responding to a reader

who'd been swindled by a car insurance salesmen. They were loudly ranting about the insurance industry when they heard the man clear his throat.

"This old guy got off his little stepladder and he turned to us and with a quavering voice said, 'You know, my brother was an insurance

> agent," Magliozzi recalled. "And I thought, 'Oh, my God, we've insulted this guy and his family!' And in the next breath, he said, 'And he screwed everybody!""

They had no idea just how long the man's handiwork would remain in its perch atop the square.

"We didn't even know how long the show was going to last on NPR," Magliozzi said. "But they foolishly kept renewing our contract."

They did have an inkling that the sign would make an

become one of the city's most treasured, if unusual, landmarks. In case there was any doubt about its historic significance, the sign most recently survived extensive renovations in the building where it's long held court, after city officials mandated that it be preserved.

Work on the property finished last year, and retail tenants have moved in, including a soon-to-open Union Square Donuts outpost. As Harvard Square continues to rapidly change, the sign — perhaps the world's most famous joke written in hand-laid gold letters --- will remain there indefinitely. Page 8

Congratulations to James Strickland who won the People's Choice Award for his 1966 Jaguar XJ13 Recreation. There is only one original 1966 XJ13, which was built to race at the 1967 Le Mans, but was disqualified due to its large V12 engine. The original was wrecked on the track, but was later restored by Abby Panels, and now reposes at the Jaguar Heritage Trust Museum, in Coventry, England.

James is the proud owner of one of the few replicas assembled from 2008 to 2015 by

Performance Classics of Cleves, Ohio. The body was by The Sports Cars Factory in Maryland who assigned it SCF No. 001. James was finally able to obtain the car in September 2022 after chasing it for fifteen years through six different owners. As of September 2022, there are less than 50 replicas of the XJ13 in the world. Dave




