Our purpose for gathering was to tour the facilities of McMichael Motorsports, the exclusive southeastern dealer for Superformance, the builder of exotic replica cars. McMichael Motorsports' owner Rob Ginn led our tour of the 6,000 square foot

showroom and shop facility.

Upon entering the showroom, my eyes danced from the Superformance MKIII, to the Superformance

Coupe, and finally to the Superformance GT 40. The MKIII and Coupe are exacting replicas of the Shelby Cobra and Cobra Daytona Coupe built and campaigned by Carroll Shelby in the 1960s. And, according to company literature, more than 90% of

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Tour of McMichael Motorsports (Do You Need A Car Like This?)

the Superformance GT40's parts are interchangeable with the original car. McMichael Motorsports takes delivery of Superformance vehicles as rolling chassis. The Superformance factory building process is from the ground up and does not make use of any donor vehicles

or parts. Customers can chose among different paint colors, wheel and tire packages, and engine and transmission combination. The recommended engines are Ford V-8s, like the \$19,000 Roush motor that was on display in the showroom.

The McMichael's shop area was not a buzz of activity on the day of our visit—after all, it was a Saturday. One employee was detailing a Superformance Coupe and a Superformance GT 40 was opened up for our inspection. Several of us were able to slide into the driver's seat of the GT40,

but getting out proved to be a challenge. Even when equipped with air-conditioning and leather seats, the Superformance GT40 is very much a tight fitting, street legal racecar. Also in the shop area was a mid-1960s Mustang fastback that was being upgraded to Shelby Mustang specifications. McMichael Motorsports calls this creation the M3 Mustang, and it reportedly can be had for about a third of the cost of an authentic Shelby Mustang.

As with replicas of any original product, trademark infringements are always an issue. Fortunately for McMichael Motorsports, Superformance and Carroll Shelby Licensing, Inc. announced on February 4, 2005 a settlement of their disagreements regarding "alleged trademark and trade dress infringements." Thus, the statement, "Built under license from Carroll Shelby Licensing Inc." appears on the Superformance website along side information about the MKIII and Coupe.

While the showroom and shop tour was informative and interesting, I got out of bed on this Saturday in hopes of actually driving an example of the Superformance MKIII. I was not disappointed! Strapped into the driver's seat with Rob Ginn riding shotgun, I slowly maneuvered the 500+ horsepower, silver MKIII out of the parking lot and then hit the gas. It was a rush! As I shifted from first gear at about 50 miles per hour, two questions came to my mind: "Do you need a car like this?" "Do you want a car like this?" Viewers of Dream Car Garage on the Speed Channel will recognize these questions as the ones asked by Tom Hnatiw as he test drives a different exotic car during each episode.

My answer to the first question is a resounding "No." No sane
