Hilton Head Island Concours d'Elegance Meet Natalie Bluestein Women Driving America Honoree

We Asked. She Answered. Get to know a little more about Natalie, a woman driving America.

Q: What is a favorite car you've owned or own now?

I've loved every car I've owned, but I have a tie for favorite car. I have a 1969 Series II Jaguar XKE which I absolutely adore. I drive it frequently, and it's about the most fun you can legally have in a car!

My other favorite is the 1961 Alvis TD21 that I'm showing on Saturday at the HHI Concours Women Driving event. It is a beautiful car, all handbuilt, and it's stunning with the convertible top up or down. It is an automatic, unlike the Jag, and drives as smoothly as a Rolls or Bentley (at a fraction of the cost)!

Q: What makes the HHI Concours special?

One of the things I love about the HHI Concours is that it has retained its local flavor, even as it has grown into one of the best Concours in the country! Although it's

much bigger than it was when my husband and I started coming, we still run into lots of friends every year. We have also met lots of new people who have become friends through talking about their cars and ours at the Concours — it's been a great resource for trouble shooting about car issues and sources for parts, repairs, and restoration over the years.

Q:What is the favorite thing you've seen over the years at the HHI Concours?

That's a tough one! Every year, we see at least one car we've never known about previously, and every year there is an amazing collection of magnificent rolling art. We have learned so much about cars and eras of cars through attending the HHI Concours. At one of our first visits years ago, my husband saw a Packard Caribbean and dragged me to see it. He said "if I ever see a car like this for sale, I'm buying it!" A few years later, we saw, and bought, a very similar Packard at auction. We still own it, and it is still his favorite car.

Q: Do you prefer to drive or ride and why?

It depends on the car. There is nothing better than driving the E-Type, especially when the triple Webers roar to life! Our cars tend to be British, and most Jaguars are fun to drive, so I enjoy them. Alvis is

also a great driving car. When it comes to pre-war cars, I prefer to ride. Aside from practical issues, such as seats not moving close enough to the accelerator, clutch, and brakes, there are lots of procedures to set in motion before even starting the cars, which I do not enjoy. Sometimes, you just want to turn a key or push a button and go!



Q: If you could own any vehicle, past or present, what is it and why?

I've never driven or ridden in a Delahaye, but I think they are among the most beautiful cars ever made. Every time I see

one, it takes my breath away. We watched a TV series about a female detective in the 1920's, and the character drives a Hispano-Suiza which is also just an amazing automobile. I wouldn't say no to one of those, either!



Electric Jaguar GT Brand Era

Jaguar is moving towards an all-electric future with a £100,000 four-door GT. The car will have a new design language and a fresh visual identity, expressing the emotion of the brand. Prototypes will be tested this year, with an official unveiling planned for 2024 and sales in 2025. The GT will be the most powerful Jaguar ever made, with a range of up to 700km and rapid charging capabilities.

Jaguar is preparing for its all-electric future with the introduction

of a £100,000 four-door GT. Our exclusive image provides a glimpse of what to expect, showcasing a striking rear design that signifies a departure from the brand's current lineup. The GT features a wide stance, distinct squaredoff angles, straight lines, and a prominent diffuser. The razor-thin tail-lights and the absence of Jaguar badging further enhance its unique look.

Newly appointed JLR boss Adrian Mardell expressed a clear desire to take Jaguar in a new direction with a fresh visual identity that truly captures the brand's emotion. The design team at Jaguar produced multiple options for

consideration, and the image we see here represents the first interpretation of a new design language. This design was unanimously chosen by key stakeholders and is described by Mardell as "jawdropping."

The rapid design process, known as Project Renaissance, was initiated by JLR's Chief Creative Officer, Gerry McGovern. Three teams within JLR's design studio in Gaydon were given a common brief to create three distinct types of vehicles. In just three months, they produced 18 clay-model proposals.

Prototypes of the new GT are expected to undergo road testing by the end of the year, with an official unveiling planned for April or May 2024. Sales are scheduled to begin in 2025. This GT not only represents the future of Jaguar but also provides a glimpse

> into the design direction of the two upcoming crossovers. Mardell emphasizes the importance of maintaining a family look across the lineup. Jaguar is undergoing a complete reboot as part of JLR's Reimagine strategy. Rather than replacing existing models, the British brand will be positioned alongside Range Rover, Defender, and Discovery as one of JLR's four brand pillars. The threecar lineup, including the GT, will be manufactured at the Solihull plant, which will also produce the all-electric Range Rover. The GT will be the most powerful Jaguar production car to date,

surpassing the brand's current EV, the I-Pace, in terms of range and charging capacity.

While specific motor outputs and performance figures have not been released, Jaguar claims that the new GT will offer up to 700km (435 miles) of range and be capable of adding approximately 200 miles of range in just 15 minutes of rapid charging.

First production Jaguar E-Type coupé tipped to sell for £1.4M... after the owner bought it for just £1 By Danya Bazaraa, The Daily Mail

The owner is also parting with his 1961 Jaguar E-Type Series 3.8-litre Roadster

The first right-hand drive production Jaguar E-Type coupé is forecast to fetch as much as £1.4million at auction - after the current owner bought it for just £1 in 1998. The seller paid just a nominal sum

for the 1961 Jaguar E-Type Series I 3.8-Litre Fixed Head Coupé, when he bought it from Jaguar author and historian Philip Porter.

He is now selling the car alongside another rare early convertible model - the first production E-Type to be sold - at Gooding & Co's London auction on 1 September in what is described as a sale of 'two of the UK's automotive Crown Jewels'.

The coupé wears the number plate 1 VHP and has been restored to concours standard. Its anonymous

North Wales seller said: 'As well as being the first right-hand drive outside bonnet coupé to be built, this Jaguar is the only surviving chassis number one E-Type of its kind (chassis 860001). 'It cost me £1 in 2000 but I had to restore it together with 9600 HP as part of the deal, 9600 HP being the oldest E-Type in existence.'

The 1961 E-Type Series I 3.8-Litre Fixed Head Coupe is the first right-hand-drive production Fixed Head Coupe Jaguar E-Type.

The owner, who has built up a world-class car collection, added: 'Goodness knows how many famous people have sat in 1 VHP as it was initially used as demonstrator model in London for six months. 'It's beautiful, drives brilliantly and it's the first. It can't get any better than that. There is only one number one.'

A spokesperson for auctioneers Gooding & Company said: 'This historically important Jaguar was finished on July 10, 1961 in opalescent dark blue with a red leather interior.


'Not one to restore cars to become museum pieces, the owner took part in Norman Dewis (Jaguar test driver from 1952-85) commemorative runs, 17-hour drives from Coventry to Geneva in 2011 and 2021.

'The car also features in a limited-edition book commissioned by Jaguar to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the E-Type.'

The coupe will go under the hammer in London on September 1 at auction house Gooding & Co.

The coupe is expected to fetch £1m to £1.4m but a bidding war could see it sell for more/

The car enthusiast is also parting with his 1961 Jaguar E-Type Series 3.8-litre Roadster, chassis 850004 - which the auction notes say is the first production E-Type ever sold. It is expected to sell for £1.2million.



A spokesperson for Gooding & Company said: 'The car, famously



registered as 1600 RW, was the very first production E-Type to be sold. Lofty drove 850004 as his personal car and loaned it on several occasions for press coverage and publicity events.

'It appeared in numerous articles in 1961 and became a familiar sight in racing paddocks.'

The car enthusiast is also parting with his 1961 Jaguar E-Type Series 3.8-litre Roadster, chassis 850004 - the first production E-Type ever sold

The owner said: 'It has been a privilege to own them and I hope they continue to give as much pleasure to the new owners as they have to me and my family over the last 20 years'

Legendary Formula 1 champion Graham Hill was photographed sitting on the car in April 1961 wearing his laurels after taking first place at a race meeting. The Jaguar E-Type made its racing debut that day and Hill won the Oulton Park Trophy, watched by 45,000 racegoers at the Cheshire circuit.

The owner said: 'Driving an E-Type is always good fun but to be able to own two incredibly important cars just amplifies that pleasure. 'Over three decades I built up arguably one of the best Jaguar collections in the world. 'It has been a privilege to own them and I hope they continue to give as much pleasure to the new owners as they have to me and my family over the last 20 years.'

Gooding & Company auctioneer Charlie Ross said: 'Enzo Ferrari has been quoted as saying the Jaguar E-type is 'the most beautiful car in the world'.

'This pair started the obsession and the auction really does afford an opportunity for someone to purchase two of the UK's automotive Crown Jewels.'
